4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is

- 6 amended by adding Chapter 762 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 762. CAMPGROUNDS

 8 Sec. 762.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "campground"

 9 means a commercial property designed to provide cabins for

 10 transient guest use or areas for locating recreational vehicles or

 11 tents for transient guest use.
- Sec. 762.002. FLOOD RISK NOTICE. The owner or operator of a campground located on or near a body of water that is at risk of flooding shall before each camper is allowed access to the campground:
- 16 <u>(1) provide written notice to the camper, or the</u>
 17 parent or legal guardian of a camper who is a minor, of the risk of
 18 flooding at the campground; and
- (2) ensure the camper, or the parent or legal guardian
 of a camper who is a minor, signs and submits to the owner or
 operator a statement acknowledging receipt of the notice.
- Sec. 762.003. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) An owner or operator of a campground who fails to comply with Section 762.002 is liable to this state for a civil penalty of \$1,000 for each violation. Each

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- 1 day a violation continues constitutes a separate violation.
- 2 (b) The attorney general may sue to collect the penalty and
- 3 may recover attorney's fees and costs incurred in bringing an
- 4 <u>action under this section.</u>
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 6 last day of the legislative session.
