5	SECTION 1. Section 26.07, Tax Code, is amended by adding
6	Subsection (h) to read as follows:
7	(h) Notwithstanding any other law, an increase in a taxing
8	unit's maintenance and operations tax revenue derived from an
9	election under this section may not be used or transferred to an
10	entity acting on behalf of the taxing unit, including a local
11	government corporation, to repay a public security in installment
12	payments or otherwise.
13	SECTION 2. The heading to Chapter 1253, Government Code, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	CHAPTER 1253. PUBLIC SECURITIES [GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS] ISSUED
16	BY LOCAL ENTITIES [POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS]
17	SECTION 3. Chapter 1253, Government Code, is amended by
18	adding Section 1253.004 to read as follows:

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Sec. 1253.004. LIMITATION ON AUTHORITY TO USE AD VALOREM

(b) A municipality, county, or entity acting on behalf of a

TAX REVENUE TO PAY PUBLIC SECURITIES. (a) In this section,

municipality or county, including a local government corporation,

may not dedicate, pledge, or otherwise use revenue subject to

"public security" has the meaning assigned by Section 1201.002.

- 6 SECTION 4. Section 1253.004, Government Code, as added by
- 7 this Act, applies only to a public security as defined by that
- 8 section issued on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 14 legislative session.
