## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the definition of authorized emergency vehicle.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section $541.201(1)$ , Transportation Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(1) "Authorized emergency vehicle" means:
7	(A) a fire department or police vehicle;
8	(B) a public or private ambulance operated by a
9	person who has been issued a license by the Department of State
10	Health Services;
11	(C) an emergency medical services vehicle:
12	(i) authorized under an emergency medical
13	services provider license issued by the Department of State Health
14	Services under Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code; and
15	(ii) operating under a contract with an
16	emergency services district that requires the emergency medical
17	services provider to respond to emergency calls with the vehicle;
18	(D) a municipal department or public service
19	corporation emergency vehicle that has been designated or
20	authorized by the governing body of a municipality;
21	(E) a county-owned or county-leased emergency
22	management vehicle that has been designated or authorized by the
23	commissioners court;
24	(F) a vehicle that has been designated by the

- 2 (G) a private vehicle of a volunteer firefighter
- 3 or a certified emergency medical services employee or volunteer
- 4 when responding to a fire alarm or medical emergency;
- 5 (G-1) a private vehicle of a medical staff
- 6 physician or technician of a medical facility licensed by the
- 7 state, when responding to a medical emergency in a county subject to
- 8 Chapter 288, Health and Safety Code, that is designated as an
- 9 authorized emergency vehicle by the commissioners court of that
- 10 county;
- 11 (H) an industrial emergency response vehicle,
- 12 including an industrial ambulance, when responding to an emergency,
- 13 but only if the vehicle is operated in compliance with criteria in
- 14 effect September 1, 1989, and established by the predecessor of the
- 15 Texas Industrial Emergency Services Board of the State
- 16 Firefighters' and Fire Marshals' Association of Texas;
- 17 (I) a vehicle of a blood bank or tissue bank,
- 18 accredited or approved under the laws of this state or the United
- 19 States, when making emergency deliveries of blood, drugs,
- 20 medicines, or organs;
- 21 (J) a vehicle used for law enforcement purposes
- 22 that is owned or leased by a federal governmental entity; or
- 23 (K) a private vehicle of an employee or volunteer
- 24 of a county emergency management division in a county with a
- 25 population of more than 52,600 and less than 55,000 that is
- 26 designated as an authorized emergency vehicle by the commissioners
- 27 court of that county.
