- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Chapter 762 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 762. CAMPGROUND SAFETY
- 8 Sec. 762.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 9 (1) "Campground" means a commercial property designed
- 10 to provide cabins for transient overnight guest use or areas for
- 11 locating recreational vehicles or tents for transient overnight
- 12 guest use.

- (2) "Campground operator" means a person who owns,
- 14 operates, controls, or supervises a campground, regardless of
- 15 profit.
- 16 (3) "Division" means the Texas Division of Emergency
- 17 Management.
- 18 Sec. 762.002. EMERGENCY SAFETY CERTIFICATION REQUIRED. A
- 19 campground operator may not operate a campground in this state
- 20 unless the operator holds for the campground an emergency safety
- 21 certification issued under this chapter and rules adopted under
- 22 this chapter.
- 23 <u>Sec. 762.003. EMERGENCY SAFETY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM AND</u>
- 24 STANDARDS. (a) The division shall establish an emergency safety

1	certification program for campgrounds.				
2	(b) The division by rule shall prescribe the requirements				
3	for issuance of an emergency safety certification under the				
4	<pre>program. The rules must:</pre>				
5	(1) require each campground operator to develop and				
6	implement an emergency preparedness plan and submit the plan to the				
7	division for approval; and				
8	(2) prescribe:				
9	(A) the information to be included in an				
10	emergency preparedness plan;				
11	(B) the form and manner for a campground operator				
12	to submit the plan to the division for approval; and				
13	(C) the procedure for correcting and				
14	resubmitting to the division a plan the division does not approve.				
15	(c) An emergency preparedness plan must:				
16	(1) require each cabin at the campground to be				
17	equipped with a device adequate to allow communication by				
18	campground guests during an emergency without regard to access to				
19	landline technologies or cell tower connectivity, including:				
20	(A) portable satellite communications equipment;				
21	<u>or</u>				
22	(B) radios;				
23	(2) require the campground operator to post in a				
24	conspicuous location at or near the entrance of each cabin a sign				
25	informing campground guests of the procedures for safely evacuating				
26	in the event of an emergency; and				
27	(3) include any additional measures the division				

- 1 considers necessary.
- Sec. 762.004. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) An owner or operator of a
- 3 <u>campground who fails to comply with this chapter</u> is liable to this
- 4 state for a civil penalty of \$1,000 for each violation. Each day a
- 5 violation continues constitutes a separate violation.
- 6 (b) The attorney general may sue to collect the penalty and
- 7 may recover attorney's fees and costs incurred in bringing an
- 8 action under this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. Not later than March 1, 2026, the Texas Division
- 10 of Emergency Management shall adopt rules required by Chapter 762,
- 11 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Section 762.002, Health and
- 13 Safety Code, as added by this Act, a campground operator is not
- 14 required to hold an emergency safety certification for a campground
- 15 as required by that section until May 1, 2026.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 17 last day of the legislative session.
