- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 786, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 7 Chapter 495 (S.B. 1283), Acts of the 89th Legislature, Regular
- 8 Session, 2025, and effective September 1, 2025, is amended by
- 9 adding Section 786.004 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 786.004. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND CONTINGENCY
- 11 OPERATIONS PLAN; INSPECTION; ENFORCEMENT. (a) In this section,
- 12 <u>"area of refuge" means a climate-controlled area in a senior</u>
- 13 retirement community that is designated for use to provide safety,
- 14 care, and other resources to residents during a power outage or
- 15 other emergency that does not require evacuation of the facility's
- 16 <u>residents or other occupants.</u>
- 17 (b) A senior retirement community shall adopt and implement
- 18 an emergency preparedness and contingency operations plan that
- 19 requires the community in the event of a power outage to provide:
- 20 <u>(1) an area of refuge with at least 15 square feet for</u>
- 21 each resident; and
- 22 (2) notice to the appropriate local fire marshal of an
- 23 unplanned interruption or loss for more than 12 hours of electric
- 24 utility service.

- 1 (c) An emergency preparedness and contingency operations
- 2 plan adopted in accordance with this section must require a senior
- 3 retirement community to maintain a temperature between 68 and 82
- 4 degrees Fahrenheit in each area of refuge designated for use in the
- 5 event of a power outage.
- 6 (d) A senior retirement community shall at least once each
- 7 calendar year request and submit to an inspection by the
- 8 appropriate local fire marshal to verify compliance with the
- 9 requirements of this section. The fire marshal may conduct the
- 10 inspection in conjunction with an inspection verifying compliance
- 11 with applicable fire and life safety codes. In conducting the
- 12 inspection, the fire marshal shall:
- 13 <u>(1) review the emergency power components of the</u>
- 14 community's emergency preparedness and contingency operations
- 15 <u>plan;</u>
- 16 (2) verify the community's secondary power supply and
- 17 related equipment are maintained and operational;
- 18 (3) document any deficiencies discovered during the
- 19 inspection and issue written orders for the community to correct
- 20 those deficiencies within a reasonable time; and
- 21 (4) conduct any necessary subsequent inspection to
- 22 verify completion of any required corrective actions.
- (e) A municipality, county, or emergency services district
- 24 may impose a penalty or other enforcement action against a senior
- 25 retirement community that violates this section as if the community
- 26 violated the applicable fire code.
- 27 SECTION 2. Section 34.0202, Utilities Code, is amended to

2 Sec. 34.0202. PURPOSE. The purpose of this subchapter is to facilitate and provide funding for the design, procurement, installation, and use of Texas backup power packages to ensure the 4 reliability or adequacy of an electric power grid in this state for 5 6 facilities on which communities rely for health, safety, and well-being, including facilities operated by senior retirement 7 communities, as defined by Section 786.001, Health and Safety Code. 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the 9 last day of the legislative session. 10
