A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the maintenance of National Oceanic and Atmospheric
3	Administration (NOAA) weather alert radios by certain campgrounds,
4	hotels, and recreational vehicle parks.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 787 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 787. WEATHER ALERT RADIOS
9	Sec. 787.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Campground" means a public or private property
11	designed to provide cabins for transient guest use or areas for
12	locating a tent, tent trailer, pickup camper, recreational vehicle,
13	trailer, or other equipment designed for camping for transient
14	guest use.
15	(2) "Hotel" has the meaning assigned by Section
16	<u>792.001.</u>
17	(3) "NOAA weather alert radio" means a device that is:
18	(A) designed to detect, receive, and provide
19	alerts regarding warnings issued by the National Oceanic and
20	Atmospheric Administration Weather Radio system; and
21	(B) equipped with an audible alarm capable of
22	alerting occupants of the room in which the radio is installed of
23	the presence of an impending weather emergency.
24	(4) "NOAA weather alert radio for hearing-impaired

- 1 persons" means a NOAA weather alert radio that, in addition to the
- 2 features of a standard NOAA weather alert radio, is equipped with a
- 3 strobe light with a visible effective intensity of not less than 100
- 4 candela, as tested and labeled in accordance with ANSI/UL Standard
- 5 1638, and with a flash rate of not fewer than 60 and not more than
- 6 120 flashes per minute.
- 7 (5) "Recreational vehicle park" has the meaning
- 8 assigned by Section 13.087, Water Code.
- 9 Sec. 787.002. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
- 10 a campground, hotel, or recreational vehicle park that is located
- 11 wholly or partly:
- 12 (1) within the boundaries of the 100-year floodplain
- 13 as determined by the most recent maps published by the Federal
- 14 Emergency Management Authority; or
- 15 (2) within one-quarter mile of the bank of a river or
- 16 <u>creek</u>.
- 17 Sec. 787.003. NOAA WEATHER ALERT RADIOS REQUIRED. (a) Ar
- 18 operator of a campground, hotel, or recreational vehicle park to
- 19 which this chapter applies shall maintain a NOAA weather alert
- 20 radio in good working order in:
- 21 (1) each room of the hotel or permanent structure
- 22 located on the property of the campground or recreational vehicle
- 23 park that is regularly used for sleeping; and
- 24 (2) each common room or area on the property of the
- 25 campground, hotel, or recreational vehicle park that is accessible
- 26 to staff or members of the public.
- 27 (b) An operator of a campground, hotel, or recreational

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- 1 vehicle park shall, on request, provide a NOAA weather alert radio
- 2 for hearing-impaired persons for use on the property of the
- 3 campground, hotel, or recreational vehicle park.
- 4 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 9 legislative session.
