RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The city of Gonzales is celebrating the 200th
anniversary of its founding in 2025; and

3 WHEREAS, Located at the confluence of the Guadalupe and San Marcos Rivers, Gonzales was surveyed by James Kerr as the capital of 4 5 DeWitt's colony in 1825 and was named after Rafael Gonzales, governor of Coahuila and Texas; the Battle of Gonzales, a pivotal 6 7 event in the Texas Revolution, took place in October 1835 after Mexican dragoons attempted to retrieve the legendary "Come and Take 8 It" cannon that had been loaned to the town for its protection; 9 subsequently, news arrived of the defeat at the Battle of the Alamo, 10 11 and Sam Houston, who was there attempting to organize the Texas 12 army, had the town burned and ordered a retreat; the Republic of Texas annexed Gonzales and established Gonzales County in 1837; as 13 many citizens remained in exile, the city council did not have its 14 first meeting until 1839; the town was rebuilt in the following 15 16 decades, and by 1880, it boasted six churches, daily mail service, four schools, a courthouse, a 500-seat opera house, a library, gas 17 and water works, and a population of 2,900 residents; and 18

WHEREAS, Gonzales flourished in the late 19th century as a center for shipping cotton, wool, hides, cattle, horses, cottonseed, and pecans, and poultry farming later became integral to the local economy; today, Gonzales is home to more than 7,000 people; residents and visitors alike enjoy such attractions as the Gonzales Memorial Museum, which houses a collection of historical

1 artifacts and weapons, and the Come and Take It Celebration, an 2 annual festival that serves as a tribute to the firing of the first 3 shot of the Texas Revolution; and
