OFFENSE: MARKETING OR PACKAGING OF CONSUMABLE HEMP PRODUCT IN MANNER ATTRACTIVE TO MINORS. (a) In 10 this section, "minor" means a person younger than 21 years of age. 11 12 (b) A person commits an offense if the person markets, advertises, sells, or causes to be sold an edible consumable hemp 13 product containing a hemp-derived cannabinoid that: 14 (1) is in the shape of a human, animal, fruit, or 15 16 cartoon or in another shape that is attractive to minors; or (2) is in packaging or a container that: 17 18 (A) is in the shape of a human, animal, fruit, or 19 cartoon or in another shape that is attractive to minors; (B) depicts an image of a human, animal, fruit, 20 or cartoon or another image that is attractive to minors; 21 22 (C) imitates or mimics trademarks or trade dress 23 of products that are or have been primarily marketed to minors; 24 (D) includes a symbol that is primarily used to

2	(E) includes an image of a celebrity; or
3	(F) includes an image that resembles a food
4	product, including candy or juice.
5	(c) In this section, a cartoon includes a depiction of an
6	object, person, animal, creature, or any similar caricature that:
7	(1) uses comically exaggerated features and
8	attributes;
9	(2) assigns human characteristics to animals, plants,
10	or other objects; or
11	(3) has unnatural or extra-human abilities, such as
12	imperviousness to pain or injury, x-ray vision, tunneling at very
13	high speeds, or transformation.
14	(d) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
15	Sec. 443.2056. OFFENSE: MISLEADING CONSUMABLE HEMP
16	PACKAGING. (a) A person commits an offense if the person sells or
17	offers for sale a consumable hemp product that contains or is
18	marketed as containing hemp-derived cannabinoids in a package that
19	depicts any statement, artwork, or design that would likely mislead
20	a person to believe:
21	(1) the package does not contain a hemp-derived
22	cannabinoid; or
23	(2) the product is intended for medical use, including
24	by depicting a green cross.
25	(b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.
26	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect December 1, 2025.
