13 WHEREAS, Mrs. West served as a secretary at Wesley United 14 Methodist Church in Marshall until 1980, when she was named administrative secretary to the dean of student affairs at East 15 16 Texas Baptist University; she earned a bachelor's degree while working full-time, and she subsequently became director of the 17 campus student center, bookstore, and post office; after obtaining 18 an MBA in 1995, she served as an adjunct professor of marketing; she 19 retired from ETBU in 2004; and 20

21 WHEREAS, Over the decades, Mrs. West made invaluable 22 contributions to her fellow citizens; she worked with the Marshall 23 Council of Camp Fire, and she received the Luther Halsey Gulick 24 Award for extraordinary council leadership; continuing to work with
