1 WHEREAS, The untimely passing of Rebecca Wells of Linden on

2 July 25, 2025, at the age of 49, has brought profound sorrow to her

3 family, friends, and colleagues; and

WHEREAS, Born on February 16, 1976, in Williamsport,

5 Pennsylvania, the former Rebecca Ramirez was the daughter of

6 Richard and Jacqueline Ramirez; while she was a student at Texas A&M

7 University, she worked for the Texas Department of Transportation;

8 she graduated from A&M with a civil engineering degree in 1998 and

9 obtained licensure as a professional engineer; and

10 WHEREAS, In 2001, Mrs. Wells embarked on a rewarding

11 full-time career with TxDOT; early in her tenure, she began

12 focusing on system safety, and in 2005, she became involved with

13 projects that researched such issues as curve-related crashes and

14 vehicle detectors for high-speed intersections; she was named

15 director of transportation operations for the Atlanta District in

16 2018, and four years later, she was promoted to district engineer;

WHEREAS, Demonstrating a deep commitment to highway safety,

19 Mrs. Wells piloted several improvements in the Atlanta District

20 that today are recognized as statewide standards; among them are

21 the use of prefabricated rumble strips for seal coat pavements and

22 the widening of pavement striping to help reduce crashes;

23 Mrs. Wells also installed the state's first intersection conflict

24 monitoring system, oversaw the rewriting of the TxDOT speed design

- 1 manual, and lent her expertise to three National Cooperative
- 2 Highway Research Program panels; additionally, she belonged to the
- 3 TxDOT Council on System Safety, and she worked to reduce roadway
- 4 fatalities as a member of a Texas Transportation Commission safety
- 5 task force composed of representatives from TxDOT and the state's
- 6 metropolitan planning organizations; over the course of a career
- 7 spanning nearly a quarter century, she earned a reputation for her
- 8 visionary leadership, her intelligence, and her ability to bring
- 9 people together; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In all her endeavors, Mrs. Wells was blessed with
- 11 the love and support of her husband, Kyle Wells, with whom she
- 12 shared a fulfilling marriage of nearly three decades; she took
- 13 great pride in their two children, Kayden and Kendall, and she
- 14 embraced time spent with her family, finding joy in relaxing at
- 15 their beach house, paddleboarding on the lake, and sharing laughter
- 16 around the dinner table; her radiant smile could light up a room,
- 17 and she adored her dogs, Koda and Maggie Mae; a woman of faith, she
- 18 was an active member of First Baptist Church, where she mentored
- 19 youth; and
- WHEREAS, Admired for her strength, generosity, and vibrant
- 21 spirit, Rebecca Wells lived a caring and purposeful life, and her
- 22 devotion to her family and to the communities she served in her
- 23 professional career left a lasting impression on all who were
