A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the creation of a working group to study alert
- 3 notification systems.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Department" means the Department of Public Safety
- 7 of the State of Texas.
- 8 (2) "Division" means the Texas Division of Emergency
- 9 Management.
- 10 (3) "Working group" means the alert notification
- 11 system working group established by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 2. CREATION OF WORKING GROUP; COMPOSITION. (a) The
- 13 alert notification system working group is established.
- 14 (b) The working group is composed of nine members appointed
- 15 not later than December 31, 2025, by the chief of the division.
- 16 SECTION 3. DUTIES OF WORKING GROUP. (a) The working group
- 17 shall study the statewide alert notification systems used to notify
- 18 state residents of certain events, including the alert notification
- 19 systems established by the department under Subchapters K-1, L,
- 20 L-1, M, P, and Q, Chapter 411, Government Code, and any alert
- 21 notification systems, and available data in the State of Texas
- 22 Emergency Assistance Registry, operated by the division.
- 23 (b) The working group shall hold hearings and other work
- 24 sessions to conduct the study required by Subsection (a) of this

- 1 section. The study must include an evaluation of state and federal
- 2 regulations regarding alert notification systems used by the
- 3 department and the division and legislative recommendations to
- 4 address the effects of notification fatigue on the effective
- 5 operation of those systems and streamline the operation of those
- 6 systems.
- 7 (b-1) The study required by Subsection (a) of this section
- 8 must also include an evaluation of the effective operation of the
- 9 alert notification systems described by Subsection (a) of this
- 10 section with respect to certain populations, including persons who
- 11 are hard of hearing, persons with chronic illness, and senior
- 12 citizens. As needed, the working group may include legislative
- 13 recommendations in the study on improving the effective operation
- 14 of the alert notification systems for those populations.
- 15 (c) The working group may consult with the Federal Emergency
- 16 Management Agency and any other federal or state agency for the
- 17 purpose of collecting information necessary to conduct the study
- 18 required by this section.
- 19 SECTION 4. REPORT AND LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS. (a)
- 20 Not later than December 1, 2026, the working group shall submit to
- 21 the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 22 representatives, and each other member of the legislature a report
- 23 on the findings of the study required by this Act.
- 24 (b) The report must include recommendations for legislation
- 25 to address the findings of the study.
- 26 SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. The working group is abolished and
- 27 this Act expires January 1, 2027.

- 1 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect on the
- 2 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
