- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1251, Government Code, as
- 5 added by Chapters 505 (S.B. 30) and 728 (H.B. 477), Acts of the 86th
- 6 Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is reenacted and amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 SUBCHAPTER B. BALLOT FOR DEBT OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY POLITICAL
- 9 SUBDIVISION
- 10 Sec. 1251.051. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 11 (1) "Debt obligation" means a public security, as
- 12 defined by Section 1201.002, secured by and payable from ad valorem
- 13 taxes. The term does not include public securities that are
- 14 designated as self-supporting by the political subdivision issuing
- 15 the securities.
- 16 (2) "Debt obligation election order" means the order,
- 17 ordinance, or resolution ordering an election to authorize the
- 18 issuance of debt obligations.
- 19 (3) "Political subdivision" means a municipality,
- 20 county, school district, or special taxing district.
- Sec. 1251.052. FORM. (a) The ballot for a measure seeking
- 22 voter approval of the issuance of debt obligations by a political
- 23 subdivision shall specifically state:
- 24 (1) a plain language description of the single

- 1 specific purpose for which the debt obligations are to be
- 2 authorized;
- 3 (2) the total principal amount of the debt obligations
- 4 to be authorized; [and]
- 5 (3) the estimated amount of taxes that would be
- 6 imposed on a taxpayer for each \$100,000 in taxable property value
- 7 for the term of each debt obligation to be authorized at the ad
- 8 valorem tax rate necessary to pay on time and in full the principal
- 9 of and interest on the debt obligation to be authorized; and
- 10 $\underline{(4)}$ that taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and
- 11 interest on the debt obligations will be imposed.
- 12 (a-1) Each single specific purpose for which debt
- 13 obligations requiring voter approval are to be issued must be
- 14 printed on the ballot as a separate proposition. A proposition may
- 15 include as a specific purpose one or more structures or
- 16 improvements serving the substantially same purpose and may include
- 17 related improvements and equipment necessary to accomplish the
- 18 specific purpose.
- 19 (b) A political subdivision with at least 250 registered
- 20 voters on the date the governing body of the political subdivision
- 21 adopts the debt obligation election order must prepare a voter
- 22 information document for each proposition to be voted on at the
- 23 election. The political subdivision shall post the voter
- 24 information document in the same manner as a debt obligation
- 25 election order is required to be posted under Section 4.003(f),
- 26 Election Code, and may include the voter information document in
- 27 the debt obligation election order. The voter information document

- 1 must distinctly state:
- 2 (1) the language that will appear on the ballot;
- 3 (2) the following information formatted as a table:
- 4 (A) the principal of the debt obligations to be
- 5 authorized;
- 6 (B) the estimated interest for the debt
- 7 obligations to be authorized;
- 8 (C) the estimated combined principal and
- 9 interest required to pay on time and in full the debt obligations to
- 10 be authorized; and
- 11 (D) as of the date the political subdivision
- 12 adopts the debt obligation election order:
- 13 (i) the principal of all outstanding debt
- 14 obligations of the political subdivision;
- 15 (ii) the estimated remaining interest on
- 16 all outstanding debt obligations of the political subdivision,
- 17 which may be based on the political subdivision's expectations
- 18 relative to the interest due on any variable rate debt obligations;
- 19 and
- 20 (iii) the estimated combined principal and
- 21 interest required to pay on time and in full all outstanding debt
- 22 obligations of the political subdivision, which may be based on the
- 23 political subdivision's expectations relative to the interest due
- 24 on any variable rate debt obligations;
- 25 (3) the estimated maximum annual increase in the
- 26 amount of taxes that would be imposed on a residence homestead in
- 27 the political subdivision with an appraised value of \$100,000 to

- 1 repay the debt obligations to be authorized, if approved, based
- 2 upon assumptions made by the governing body of the political
- 3 subdivision; and
- 4 (4) any other information that the political
- 5 subdivision considers relevant or necessary to explain the
- 6 information required by this subsection.
- 7 (c) The governing body of the political subdivision shall
- 8 identify in the voter information document the major assumptions
- 9 made in connection with the statement required by Subsection
- 10 (b)(3), including:
- 11 (1) the amortization of the political subdivision's
- 12 debt obligations, including outstanding debt obligations and the
- 13 proposed debt obligations;
- 14 (2) changes in estimated future appraised values
- 15 within the political subdivision; and
- 16 (3) the assumed interest rate on the proposed debt
- 17 obligations.
- 18 (d) A political subdivision that maintains an Internet
- 19 website shall provide the information described by Subsection (b)
- 20 on its website in an easily accessible manner beginning not later
- 21 than the 21st day before election day and ending on the day after
- 22 the date of the debt obligation election.
- (e) This section provides the ballot proposition language
- 24 for an election to authorize the issuance of debt obligations by a
- 25 political subdivision. To the extent of a conflict between this
- 26 section and another law, this section controls.
- 27 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to

- 1 an election ordered on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 3 last day of the legislative session.
