- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Title 10, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Chapter 830 to read as follows:
- 6 CHAPTER 830. INTERSTATE COMPACT FOR ANIMAL HEALTH INITIATIVES
- 7 Sec. 830.001. AUTHORITY TO DEVELOP AND EXECUTE COMPACT. On
- 8 behalf of this state, the governor shall develop and execute an
- 9 interstate compact for animal health initiatives among interested
- 10 states.

- 11 Sec. 830.002. CONGRESSIONAL APPROVAL NOT REQUIRED. (a) It
- 12 is the intent of the legislature that the compact developed and
- 13 <u>executed under this chapter not require congressional approval.</u>
- 14 (b) The compact may not increase the political power of the
- 15 compacting states in relation to the federal government.
- 16 Sec. 830.003. INTERSTATE COMPACT PROVISIONS. (a) The
- 17 compact authorized by this chapter must provide for joint action
- 18 among compacting states on matters that include:
- 19 (1) sharing state resources in order to build a
- 20 research center, a comprehensive surveillance system, and a
- 21 response plan to prevent or treat animal disease outbreaks,
- 22 including diseases caused by parasitic insects, in this state;
- 23 (2) sharing other animal health resources to ensure
- 24 the protection of livestock, wildlife, and other animals; and

- 1 (3) providing mutual support for the infrastructure,
- 2 equipment, software, personnel, and other resources that are
- 3 necessary or convenient to ensure the purposes described by this
- 4 section are adequately supported and achieved.
- 5 (b) The compact authorized by this chapter may, at the
- 6 discretion of each compacting state, provide for joint action among
- 7 the compacting states on the execution and enforcement of
- 8 agreements or memoranda of understanding with the United States
- 9 Department of Agriculture, the United States Food and Drug
- 10 Administration, the United States Environmental Protection Agency,
- 11 or any other federal agency for the purpose of protecting and
- 12 researching animal health.
- 13 (c) The compact may authorize the transfer of money from
- 14 other compacting states to this state for the purpose of supporting
- 15 <u>animal health research and response activities</u>. Any money received
- 16 under this subsection must be deposited to the credit of a separate
- 17 fund to be used only for expenses related to the planning,
- 18 development, operation, or coordination of animal health
- 19 initiatives undertaken in accordance with this compact.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 25 legislative session.
