9	SUBCHAPTER L. RIVER AUTHORITY COORDINATION IN EMERGENCY

11	Sec. 418.501. DEFINITIONS. In this section:
12	(1) "River authority" means a conservation and reclamation
13	district created under Article XVI, Section 59, of the Texas
14	Constitution that has jurisdiction over water resources within a
15	county, including but not limited to authorities created under
16	Chapters 8501-8520, Special District Local Laws Code.
17	(2) "County emergency management plan" means the emergency
18	management plan required under Section 418.106 of this code.
19	Sec. 418.502. COORDINATION REQUIREMENTS. Each river authority
20	operating within a county shall coordinate and collaborate with
21	that county's emergency management program in the development,
22	review, and updating of the county's emergency management plan as
23	<pre>it relates to:</pre>

(1) flood control and mitigation strategies;

- 1 (2) dam safety and potential dam failure scenarios;
- 2 (3) water resource management during emergencies;
- 3 (4) coordination of emergency communications regarding
- 4 water-related hazards;
- 5 (5) evacuation routes and procedures related to flooding;
- 6 (6) post-disaster recovery planning for water
- 7 <u>infrastructure</u>; and
- 8 (7) any other water-related emergency management matters
- 9 within the river authority's jurisdiction or expertise.
- 10 Sec. 503. COORDINATION ACTIVITIES. The coordination required by
- 11 this section shall include:
- 12 (1) Regular consultation between the river authority and
- 13 county emergency management personnel, with meetings held at least
- 14 annually or more frequently as determined necessary by either
- 15 <u>party;</u>
- 16 (2) Sharing of relevant data, studies, and technical
- 17 information related to flood risks, dam safety, and water
- 18 infrastructure that may be useful for emergency planning purposes;
- 19 (3) Joint participation in emergency planning exercises and
- 20 training when practicable;
- 21 <u>(4) Coordination in seeking technical assistance and</u>
- 22 expertise from the Texas Division of Emergency Management under
- 23 <u>existing programs and resources.</u>
- 24 Sec. 418.504. USE OF EXISTING RESOURCES. The river authority and
- 25 county shall utilize existing resources and personnel in fulfilling
- 26 the requirements of this section.
- 27 Sec. 505.505. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE. Both the river authority and

- 1 county are encouraged to seek technical assistance from the Texas
- 2 Division of Emergency Management, which shall provide guidance and
- 3 support using existing resources and programs available through the
- 4 division.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote
- 6 of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided
- 7 by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not
- 8 receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes
- 9 effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative
- 10 session.
