| 8 | Sec. 382.0217. MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE GROUND LEVEL |
| 9 | CONCENTRATIONS OF HYDROGEN SULFIDE. (a) To protect public health, |
| 10 | the commission shall: |
| 11 | (1) by rule establish maximum allowable ground level |
| 12 | concentrations of hydrogen sulfide; and |
| 13 | (2) subject to Subsection (b), review the latest |
| 14 | health studies regarding hydrogen sulfide emissions and reevaluate |
| 15 | the maximum allowable concentrations at least once every five |
| 16 | years. |
| 17 | (b) In establishing the maximum allowable concentrations, |
| 18 | the commission: |
| 19 | (1) may establish different concentrations based or |
| 20 | whether an area is used for residential, recreational, business, |
| 21 | commercial, or agricultural purposes; and |

(2) may not allow any person to cause or allow

- 2 (A) 0.04 parts per million averaged over any

- 5 commercial purposes; or
- 6 (B) 0.06 parts per million averaged over any
- 7 30-minute period if the downwind concentration of hydrogen sulfide
- 8 affects only property used for purposes other than residential,
- 9 recreational, business, or commercial purposes.
- 10 <u>(c) The commission by rule shall classify a violation of the</u>
- 11 allowable ground level concentrations established by this section
- 12 as having major significance under Section 5.754, Water Code.
- SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2026, the Texas
- 14 Commission on Environmental Quality shall adopt rules required by
- 15 Section 382.0217, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 17 last day of the legislative session.
