- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 141, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Sections 141.0091, 141.021, and 141.022 to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 Sec. 141.0091. FLOOD SAFETY REQUIREMENTS. (a) This
- 9 section does not apply to a youth camp subject to a flood plan as
- 10 designated under state or federal law.
- 11 (b) A youth camp operator shall for each youth camp cabin
- 12 used as an overnight accommodation for campers provide:
- 13 (1) a life jacket for each camper assigned to the
- 14 cabin; and
- 15 (2) life rafts with sufficient capacity to support the
- 16 maximum number of campers that may be assigned to the cabin.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> The department shall monitor youth camps for compliance
- 18 with this section and post reports of noncompliance on the
- 19 <u>department's Internet website.</u>
- Sec. 141.021. STUDY ON COST OF LIFE JACKETS AND LIFE RAFTS
- 21 FOR YOUTH CAMPS. (a) The department shall conduct a study on the
- 22 cost of providing youth camp cabins with:
- 23 (1) a life jacket for each camper assigned to the
- 24 cabin; and

- 1 (2) life rafts with sufficient capacity to support the
- 2 maximum number of campers that may be assigned to the cabin.
- 3 (b) This section expires September 1, 2027.
- 4 Sec. 141.022. SAFETY MEASURE STATE GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The
- 5 department shall establish a program to award grants to cover 50
- 6 percent of the costs incurred by a youth camp operator to equip each
- 7 youth camp cabin with:
- 8 (1) a life jacket for each camper assigned to the
- 9 cabin; and
- 10 (2) life rafts with sufficient capacity to support the
- 11 maximum number of campers that may be assigned to the cabin.
- 12 (b) The legislature shall appropriate \$10 million for the
- 13 grant program established under this section.
- 14 (c) This section expires September 1, 2031.
- 15 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Section 141.0091, Health and
- 16 Safety Code, as added by this Act, a youth camp operator who is
- 17 operating a youth camp on the effective date of this Act is not
- 18 required to comply with the requirements of that section until
- 19 January 1, 2029.
- 20 SECTION 3. The Department of State Health Services shall
- 21 complete the study required by Section 141.021, Health and Safety
- 22 Code, as added by this Act, not later than April 1, 2026.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 24 last day of the legislative session.
