## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, The Texas Constitution, Article III, Section 5,
- 2 mandates that members of the Texas House of Representatives fulfill
- 3 their legislative duties during sessions called by the Governor,
- 4 including special sessions convened to address critical state
- 5 matters; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A quorum, defined as two-thirds of the elected
- 7 members of the Texas House of Representatives, is required to
- 8 conduct official legislative business, as established by Texas
- 9 House Rule 5, Section 1, and Article III, Section 10 of the Texas
- 10 Constitution; and
- 11 WHEREAS, On August 3, 2025, a significant number of
- 12 Democratic members of the Texas House of Representatives
- 13 deliberately absented themselves from the state to prevent the
- 14 establishment of a quorum, thereby obstructing legislative
- 15 proceedings during a special session called to address urgent
- 16 issues, including congressional redistricting; and
- 17 WHEREAS, This intentional quorum break, publicly
- 18 acknowledged by participating Democratic members, disrupted the
- 19 legislative process, delayed critical legislation, and imposed
- 20 financial burdens on the state through the costs associated with
- 21 efforts to restore quorum; and
- WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives has the authority
- 23 under its rules to impose penalties for actions that undermine its
- 24 ability to function, including the absence of members for the

- 1 purpose of denying a quorum, as demonstrated by the adoption of
- 2 fines for quorum-breaking in 2023; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Monetary punishments are a necessary and
- 4 appropriate response to ensure accountability and deter future
- 5 disruptions of the legislative process; now, therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Texas House of Representatives of the 89th
- 7 Legislature hereby:
- 8 1. Imposes a Daily Fine: All Democratic members who
- 9 participated in the quorum break beginning on August 3, 2025, shall
- 10 be fined \$500 per day for each day they were absent from the House
- 11 without leave, starting from the date the quorum was broken until
- 12 their return or the conclusion of the special session, with fines to
- 13 be deducted from their legislative salaries or personal funds; and
- 2. Permanently Reduces Office Budgets: The office
- 15 budgets of all Democratic members who participated in the quorum
- 16 break shall be reduced by 30 percent for the remainder of the 89th
- 17 Legislature, reflecting the financial impact of their absence on
- 18 the efficient operation of the House; and
- 19 3. Removes Stipends for Committee Chairs: All
- 20 Democratic members who participated in the quorum break and hold
- 21 committee chairmanships shall have any stipends or additional
- 22 compensation associated with those positions revoked for the
- 23 duration of the 89th Legislature, as their actions demonstrate a
- 24 failure to fulfill the responsibilities of leadership; and
- 4. Requires Payment of Retrieval Costs: All Democratic
- 26 members who participated in the quorum break shall be jointly and
- 27 severally responsible for reimbursing the state for costs incurred

- 1 in efforts to restore quorum, including but not limited to expenses
- 2 for law enforcement, legal actions, or other measures authorized by
- 3 the House or the Governor, with such costs to be assessed and
- 4 collected by the House Administration Committee; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the Texas House of
- 6 Representatives shall direct the House Administration Committee to
- 7 calculate and enforce the fines, budget reductions, stipend
- 8 removals, and retrieval cost assessments, ensuring compliance with
- 9 all applicable House rules and state laws; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Speaker shall notify affected members of
- 11 their obligations under this resolution and provide a mechanism for
- 12 appeal consistent with House rules; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That this resolution takes effect immediately upon
- 14 its adoption by a majority vote of the Texas House of
- 15 Representatives, in accordance with House rules and applicable
- 16 state law.
