- WHEREAS, Mr. Wade began the next chapter of his life by
- 14 earning a bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of
- 15 Central Texas; he went on to work with the chambers of commerce in
- 16 Harker Heights and Copperas Cove before serving as executive vice
- 17 president of the Greater Killeen Chamber of Commerce from 1996
- 18 until his retirement in 2014; in addition to overseeing events and
- 19 providing assistance to local entrepreneurs, he was involved in
- 20 efforts to expand retail along Interstate 14, and he was
- 21 instrumental in developing the chamber's Military Relations
- 22 Council; he was also a member of the noon Rotary and served on
- 23 several city committees; and
- 24 WHEREAS, A devoted family man, Mr. Wade shared a fulfilling

- 1 relationship of nearly five decades with his wife, the former Carol
- 2 Henderson Bell; they became the parents of four children, Susan,
- 3 Blake, Kenneth, and Christina, and through the years, the family
- 4 grew to include 15 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren;
- 5 Mr. Wade was an active member of First Baptist Church of Killeen,
- 6 where he sang in the choir and served on committees; after he and
- 7 his wife moved to College Station, near two of their children, he
- 8 joined the congregation at First Baptist Bryan; and

- 10 his family, his community, and his country, and he will forever be a
- 11 source of inspiration to those he left behind; now, therefore, be it
