R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Family and friends will forever treasure their
2 memories of Oscar Rolando Correa of Salado, who passed away on July
3 31, 2025, at the age of 68; and

4 WHEREAS, Born on July 4, 1957, "Rolly" Correa graduated from
5 Central Texas College in 1978 and went on to attend the Texas Parks
6 and Wildlife Department Game Warden Training Academy; embarking on
7 a decades-long career in law enforcement, he completed his first
8 duty assignment as a game warden in San Antonio, earning the rank of
9 lieutenant, and he was subsequently promoted to the role of major
10 game warden when he transferred to Temple in 1993; while in Temple,
11 he was responsible for managing field operations for 24 counties in
12 Central Texas; and

13 WHEREAS, After retiring from his work with TPWD in 2010,
14 Mr. Correa successfully ran for election as a Bell County constable
15 in 2013; throughout his nearly 12-year-long tenure, he ably
16 fulfilled the duties of his office and earned the respect and
17 admiration of his constituents in Precinct 2; and

18 WHEREAS, Mr. Correa served his community of faith with equal
19 commitment; from June 2010 to June 2024, he held the role of mission
20 and outreach director at the Salado United Methodist Church, where
21 he was beloved by the congregation; in addition to working to meet
22 local needs in Salado, he coordinated relief efforts in places
23 across the United States that had been impacted by disasters, and he
24 led international mission teams to help people in Haiti, Belize,

1 and Africa; for many years, he also served on the board of directors
2 for J.A.I.L. Ministry, Inc.; and

3 WHEREAS, Deeply devoted to his family, Mr. Correa shared a
4 rewarding marriage with his wife of more than 45 years, Beth, and he
5 cherished their three children, Dustin, Andrea, and Tyler; he was
6 further blessed with five grandchildren, who brought him great
7 pride and joy; and

8 WHEREAS, Admired for his loyalty, generosity, and strength of
9 character, Rolly Correa led a caring and purposeful life, and he
10 will forever hold a special place in the hearts of those who held
11 him dear; now, therefore, be it

12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 89th Texas
13 Legislature, 2nd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the memory
14 of Oscar Rolando Correa and extend deepest sympathy to the members
15 of his family: to his wife, Beth Correa; to his children, Dustin,
