- 2 relating to campground and youth camp safety.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Heaven's 27 Camp
- 5 Safety Act.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 141.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (1-a),
- 8 (2-a), (2-b), and (2-c) to read as follows:
- 9 (1) "Cabin" means a structure used to provide
- 10 temporary sleeping quarters for campers.
- 11 (1-a) "Camper" means a minor who is attending a youth
- 12 camp on a day care or boarding basis.
- 13 (2-a) "Floodplain" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 14 762.001.
- 15 "Floodway" means an area identified on the most
- 16 recent flood hazard map published by the Federal Emergency
- 17 Management Agency under the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968
- 18 (42 U.S.C. Section 4001 et seq.) as a regulatory floodway.
- 19 <u>(2-c)</u> "Governmental entity" means this state or a
- 20 state agency or political subdivision of this state.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 141.005(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) A person holding a license issued under this chapter
- 24 must:

- 1 (1) renew the license annually by submitting a renewal
- 2 application on a date determined by department rule on a form
- 3 provided by the department; and
- 4 (2) submit a renewal application not later than the
- 5 30th day after the date the person:
- 6 (A) alters the boundaries of a youth camp
- 7 operated by the person;
- 8 <u>(B) completes construction of one or more new</u>
- 9 cabins located on the premises of a youth camp operated by the
- 10 person; or
- (C) completes any renovation to one or more
- 12 existing cabins located on the premises of the youth camp operated
- 13 by the person that:
- (i) increases or decreases the number of
- 15 beds in an affected cabin; or
- 16 <u>(ii)</u> alters the method of ingress or egress
- 17 to an affected cabin.
- 18 SECTION 4. Chapter 141, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 19 by adding Sections 141.0052, 141.0056, 141.0091, and 141.0092 to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 141.0052. PROHIBITED LICENSURE OF YOUTH CAMPS WITHIN
- 22 FLOODPLAIN; EXCEPTION. (a) The department shall not issue or renew
- 23 a youth camp license for a youth camp that operates one or more
- 24 <u>cabins located within a floodplain.</u>
- 25 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the department may
- 26 issue or renew a license to a youth camp described by Subsection (a)
- 27 only if:

1	(1) each cabin location within a floodplain is a
2	result of the cabin's proximity to a lake, pond, or other still body
3	of water that:
4	(A) is not connected to a stream, river, or other
5	watercourse; or
6	(B) is dammed; or
7	(2) each cabin is at least 1,000 feet from a floodway.
8	Sec. 141.0056. ONLINE YOUTH CAMP REGISTRY. The department
9	shall post, maintain, and update on the department's Internet
10	website a list of each youth camp with an active license issued
11	under this chapter.
12	Sec. 141.0091. ADDITIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS. (a)
13	As part of the health and safety standards established under
14	Section 141.009, the executive commissioner by rule shall make
15	applicable to a youth camp the requirements of Chapter 762 in the
16	same manner as those requirements apply to a campground under that
17	chapter.
18	(b) The executive commissioner by rule shall require a youth
19	camp operator in the emergency evacuation plan the operator
20	develops for a youth camp as required under Section 762.002 to:
21	(1) specify muster zones for campers and camp staff to
22	gather in an emergency event that requires evacuation from any
23	location within the premises of the camp;
24	(2) establish procedures for responding to ar
25	emergency event, other than an event addressed by Section 762.002,
26	including:

(A) a lost camper;

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1	(B) a fire on the premises of the camp;
2	(C) a severe injury, severe illness, or death of
3	one or more campers, visitors, camp staff, or camp volunteers that
4	occurs:
5	(i) on camp premises; or
6	(ii) while under the supervision of camp
7	staff;
8	(D) an aquatic emergency if the camp borders a
9	watercourse, lake, pond, or any other body of water; and
10	(E) any other natural disaster or emergency event
11	required under department rules;
12	(3) establish procedures to identify and account for
13	each camper affected by the emergency event;
14	(4) establish procedures to notify and communicate
15	with:
16	(A) local emergency management services,
17	including the emergency management director or coordinator
18	designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code, by the
19	political subdivision within which the camp is located;
20	(B) camp administrative and medical services
21	staff; and
22	(C) the parents or legal guardians of each camper
23	identified under Subdivision (3); and
24	(5) designate a camp emergency preparedness
25	<pre>coordinator.</pre>
26	(c) The executive commissioner by rule shall require a youth
27	camp operator to:

1	(1) maintain an operable radio capable of providing
2	real-time weather alerts issued by the National Weather Service or
3	a similar professional weather service at the camp;
4	(2) install and maintain at the camp an emergency
5	warning system that:
6	(A) is capable of alerting all campers and camp
7	occupants of an emergency; and
8	(B) includes a public address system operable
9	without reliance on an Internet connection;
10	(3) monitor safety alerts issued:
11	(A) by the National Weather Service or a similar
12	professional weather service; and
13	(B) by local river authorities, if applicable to

the camp, or through other local emergency notification systems;

and

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- (d) In developing an emergency plan under Subsection (a), a
- 19 youth camp operator must annually submit the initial or updated
- 20 plan to the department for approval in the form and manner the
- 21 department prescribes.
- 22 <u>(e) If the department determines an emergency plan</u>
- 23 <u>submitted under this section or Section 762.002 does not meet the</u>
- 24 minimum standards prescribed by department rules under this
- 25 section, the youth camp operator shall revise and resubmit the plan
- 26 not later than the 45th day after the date the operator receives
- 27 notice from the department of the plan's deficiencies.

- 1 <u>(f) A youth camp operator shall include any updated</u> 2 <u>emergency plan as an attachment to each application to renew the</u>
- 3 operator's license under Section 141.005.
- 4 (g) Notwithstanding Section 762.002(c), not later than the
- 5 10th business day following the date the department approves a
- 6 youth camp operator's emergency plan or, if the department
- 7 determines the plan is deficient under Subsection (e), the
- 8 operator's revised emergency plan, the operator shall provide a
- 9 copy of the plan to:
- 10 (1) for a campground located in a municipality, the
- 11 emergency management director or coordinator designated under
- 12 Section 418.1015, Government Code, for the municipality; and
- 13 (2) the emergency management director or coordinator
- 14 designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code, for the county.
- 15 (h) In developing an emergency plan under this section, a
- 16 youth camp operator may consult with an emergency management
- 17 <u>director or coordinator described by Subsection (g).</u>
- 18 (i) The department shall store in a digital database each
- 19 emergency plan submitted under this section or Section 762.002 and
- 20 provide access to that database to the Texas Division of Emergency
- 21 Management.
- 22 <u>(j)</u> A youth camp operator shall:
- 23 (1) make available the most recent version of an
- 24 emergency plan submitted under this section to the parent or legal
- 25 guardian of:
- 26 (A) a camper who is participating in a camp
- 27 session; or

1	(B) a prospective camper who is registered to
2	participate in a future camp session; and
3	(2) notify the parent or legal guardian of a camper or
4	prospective camper described by Subdivision (1) if any part of the
5	camp is located within a floodplain.
6	(k) Not more than 48 hours after each camp session begins,
7	the youth camp operator or a camp staff member shall conduct a
8	mandatory safety orientation that:
9	(1) notifies each camper of the camp's boundaries and
10	any hazards present on the camp premises;
11	(2) instructs each camper on behavioral expectations
12	in an emergency event; and
13	(3) trains each camper on the appropriate actions and
14	procedures to follow in an emergency event, in accordance with the
15	camp's emergency plan required under this section and Section
16	762.002.
17	(1) At least once a year, a youth camp operator shall:
18	(1) provide each camp staff member and volunteer with
19	a copy of the camp's most recent emergency plan;
20	(2) train each camp staff member and volunteer on the
21	contents of the camp's emergency plan;
22	(3) instruct each camp staff member and volunteer on
23	the proper procedures to follow in an emergency event under the
24	<pre>camp's emergency plan; and</pre>
24 25	<pre>camp's emergency plan; and</pre>

training required under this subsection.

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- 1 (m) A youth camp operator shall:
- 2 (1) conspicuously post in each cabin the proper
- 3 evacuation route described in the camp's emergency plan under this
- 4 section and Section 762.002; and
- 5 (2) ensure each evacuation route on the camp premises,
- 6 described in the emergency plan under this section and Section
- 7 762.002, is illuminated at night.
- 8 (n) Notwithstanding Section 141.0025, the department shall
- 9 not grant a waiver from a requirement prescribed under this section
- 10 or Chapter 762.
- 11 (o) An emergency plan submitted to, received by, or accessed
- 12 by the department, the Texas Division of Emergency Management, an
- 13 emergency management director or coordinator designated under
- 14 Section 418.1015, Government Code, or any other governmental entity
- 15 under this section is confidential and not subject to disclosure
- 16 under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 17 <u>Sec. 141.0092. REDUNDANT INTERNET CONNECTIONS REQUIRED.</u>
- 18 (a) In this section, "broadband service" has the meaning assigned
- 19 by Section 490I.0101, Government Code.
- 20 (b) A youth camp operator shall provide and maintain for a
- 21 youth camp:
- 22 (1) Internet services through a broadband service that
- 23 connects to the Internet using end-to-end fiber optic facilities;
- 24 and
- 25 (2) a secondary Internet connection through a
- 26 broadband service distinct from the service described under
- 27 Subdivision (1).

- 1 SECTION 5. Section 141.008(a), Health and Safety Code, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The executive commissioner may adopt rules to implement
- 4 this chapter. In adopting the rules the executive commissioner
- 5 shall comply with Subchapter B, Chapter 2001, Government Code,
- 6 including Sections 2001.032(b) and 2001.033, Government Code. [In
- 7 developing the rules to be adopted by the executive commissioner,
- 8 the department shall consult parents, youth camp operators, and
- 9 appropriate public and private officials and organizations.
- 10 SECTION 6. Subtitle A, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Chapter 762 to read as follows:
- 12 CHAPTER 762. CAMPGROUND SAFETY
- Sec. 762.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 14 (1) "Cabin" means a structure used to provide
- 15 temporary sleeping quarters for transient overnight guests.
- 16 (2) "Campground" means, regardless of profit:
- 17 <u>(A) a commercial property designed to provide</u>
- 18 cabins for transient overnight guest use; or
- (B) a recreational vehicle park, as defined by
- 20 Section 13.087, Water Code.
- 21 (3) "Campground operator" means a person who owns,
- 22 operates, controls, or supervises a campground, regardless of
- 23 profit.
- 24 (4) "Floodplain" means any area within a 100-year
- 25 floodplain identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency
- 26 under the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. Section
- 27 4001 et seq.). This term includes any area removed from the

2 revision based on fill, or a substantially similar administrative 3 process conducted by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. (5) "Governmental entity" means this state or a state 4 agency or political subdivision of this state. 5 6 Sec. 762.002. FLOODPLAIN SAFETY REQUIREMENTS. (a) 7 campground operator shall: 8 (1) install and maintain in each campground cabin located within the floodplain an emergency ladder capable of 9 providing access to the cabin's roof; and 10 11 (2) develop an emergency evacuation plan for: 12 (A) evacuating on issuance of a flash flood or 13 flood warning campground occupants who are at a campground area 14 within the floodplain; 15 (B) evacuating campground occupants on issuance 16 of an evacuation order by the emergency management director or coordinator designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code, 17 for the county or, if applicable, the municipality in which the 18 campground is located, due to a wildfire, hurricane, or other 19 20 disaster; and 21 (C) sheltering campground occupants in place on 22 issuance of:

100-year floodplain by a letter of map amendment, a letter of map

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the emergency management director or coordinator for the county or,

if applicable, the municipality in which the campground is located.

(b) A campground operator shall:

(i) a tornado warning; or

(ii) an order to shelter in place issued by

- 1 (1) implement the emergency evacuation plan developed
- 2 under Subsection (a)(2)(A) on issuance by the National Weather
- 3 Service of a flash flood or flood warning for an area of the
- 4 campground; and
- 5 (2) implement the emergency evacuation plan developed
- 6 under Subsection (a)(2)(C) on issuance by the National Weather
- 7 Service of a tornado warning for an area of the campground.
- 8 (c) A campground operator shall send a copy of an emergency
- 9 evacuation plan developed under Subsection (a)(2) to:
- 10 (1) for a campground located in a municipality, the
- 11 emergency management director or coordinator designated under
- 12 Section 418.1015, Government Code, for the municipality; and
- 13 (2) the emergency management director or coordinator
- 14 designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code, for the county.
- 15 (d) An emergency plan submitted to, received by, or accessed
- 16 by an emergency management director or coordinator under Section
- 17 418.1015, Government Code, or any governmental entity under this
- 18 section is confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter
- 19 552, Government Code.
- Sec. 762.003. FIRE PROTECTION STANDARDS. (a) This section
- 21 does not apply to a campground owned or controlled by a governmental
- 22 entity.
- 23 (b) A campground must comply with the National Fire
- 24 Protection Association 1194, Standard for Recreational Vehicle
- 25 Parks and Campgrounds, 2021 Edition, other than Sections 1.1.1 and
- 26 5.1.1.1.
- 27 (c) A governmental entity may adopt a policy, rule,

- 1 ordinance, or order to regulate environmental health and
- 2 <u>sanitation</u>, <u>electrical distribution system safety</u>, <u>liquefied</u>
- 3 petroleum gas storage and dispensing safety, or fire protection
- 4 only if the policy, rule, ordinance, or order does not impose
- 5 standards more stringent than the standards described under
- 6 Subsection (b).
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 141.0035(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 8 repealed.
- 9 SECTION 8. Not later than January 1, 2026, the executive
- 10 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 11 adopt the rules required by Section 141.0091, Health and Safety
- 12 Code, as added by this Act.
- 13 SECTION 9. Notwithstanding Section 141.0091, Health and
- 14 Safety Code, as added by this Act, a youth camp operator is not
- 15 required to submit an emergency plan to the Department of State
- 16 Health Services until April 1, 2026.
- 17 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 18 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 19 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 20 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 21 effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of
- 22 the legislative session.
