A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to powers and duties of the Texas Division of Emergency
- 3 Management for a local state of disaster; enhancing a criminal
- 4 penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 108.001(3), Business & Commerce Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (3) "Declared disaster" means:
- 9 (A) a disaster declared by the president of the
- 10 United States;
- 11 (B) a state of disaster declared by the governor
- 12 under Chapter 418, Government Code; or
- 13 (C) a local state of disaster declared by the
- 14 governing body of a political subdivision or the administrative
- 15 head of the Texas Division of Emergency Management under Section
- 16 418.108, Government Code.
- SECTION 2. Section 37.004(g), Government Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (g) In this section, "declaration of a state of disaster"
- 20 means a declaration made by:
- 21 (1) the president of the United States under the
- 22 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42
- 23 U.S.C. Section 5121 et seq.);
- 24 (2) the governor under Section 418.014; or

- 1 (3) the presiding officer of the governing body of a
- 2 political subdivision or the administrative head of the Texas
- 3 Division of Emergency Management under Section 418.108.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 418.108, Government Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsections (a-1) and (h-1) and amending Subsections (b) and
- 6 (e) to read as follows:
- 7 (a-1) The division shall monitor political subdivisions for
- 8 conditions for which a declaration of a local state of disaster may
- 9 be appropriate. If the division determines a local state of
- 10 disaster should be declared for a political subdivision, the
- 11 situation involves imminent harm to individuals in the political
- 12 <u>subdivision</u>, and the <u>governor or appropriate</u> officials of the
- 13 political subdivision are likely not available, the division shall
- 14 immediately attempt to notify the executive head of that political
- 15 <u>subdivision of the determination. The administrative head of the</u>
- 16 <u>division may declare a local state of disaster for the political</u>
- 17 subdivision if the political subdivision does not respond within a
- 18 reasonable time after the division attempts to provide the notice.
- 19 (b) A declaration of local disaster may not be continued or
- 20 renewed for a period of more than seven days except with the consent
- 21 of the governing body of the political subdivision or the joint
- 22 board as provided by Subsection (e), as applicable. The governing
- 23 body of the political subdivision may rescind a declaration of
- 24 local disaster issued by the administrative head of the division
- 25 under Subsection (a-1).
- 26 (e) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), the [The] chief
- 27 administrative officer of a joint board has exclusive authority to

- 1 declare that a local state of disaster exists within the boundaries
- 2 of an airport operated or controlled by the joint board, regardless
- 3 of whether the airport is located in or outside the boundaries of a
- 4 political subdivision.
- 5 (h-1) For a political subdivision for which the
- 6 administrative head of the division declares a local state of
- 7 disaster under Subsection (a-1) and until the governor or
- 8 appropriate officials of the political subdivision are available,
- 9 the division may:
- 10 (1) order the evacuation of all or part of the
- 11 population from a disaster area in the political subdivision if the
- 12 division considers the action necessary for the preservation of
- 13 life or other disaster mitigation, response, or recovery; and
- 14 (2) control ingress to and egress from a disaster area
- 15 and control the movement of individuals and the occupancy of
- 16 premises in that area.
- SECTION 4. Section 12.50(a), Penal Code, is amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 (a) Subject to Subsections (c) and (d), the punishment for
- 20 an offense described by Subsection (b) is increased to the
- 21 punishment prescribed for the next higher category of offense if it
- 22 is shown on the trial of the offense that the offense was committed
- 23 in an area that was, at the time of the offense:
- 24 (1) subject to a declaration of a state of disaster
- 25 made by:
- 26 (A) the president of the United States under the
- 27 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42

- 1 U.S.C. Section 5121 et seq.);
- 2 (B) the governor under Section 418.014,
- 3 Government Code; or
- 4 (C) the presiding officer of the governing body
- 5 of a political subdivision or the administrative head of the Texas
- 6 <u>Division of Emergency Management</u> under Section 418.108, Government
- 7 Code; or
- 8 (2) subject to an emergency evacuation order.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 10 last day of the legislative session.
