WHEREAS, Margaret has earned the respect and admiration of Austinites through her hands-on approach to leadership, which has included holding frequent public hearings, personally communicating with constituents, and informing voters about timely and relevant issues; she holds a bachelor's degree from Saint Edward's University, and she earned a master's degree from the school while fulfilling her duties as a county official; her numerous accolades and honors include being named Woman of the Year by the Texas Women's Political Caucus; and

WHEREAS, Known for promoting a long-term perspective in county governance, Margaret has tackled difficult issues with wisdom, integrity, and compassion, and her insight has helped to guide more than a half-century of progress in the region; she is a widely beloved public servant, and her outstanding contributions have made a positive and lasting impact in the lives of Travis County residents; now, therefore, be it
