RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Members of the Irving Fire Department are joining 2 with city residents on September 20, 2025, to celebrate the 100th

3 anniversary of the agency's founding; and

WHEREAS, Established in 1925 with just 20 volunteers, the

5 Irving Fire Department originally served an area spanning one

6 square mile, and its members put out fires with a four-wheel pull

7 cart carrying a 20-gallon water barrel, a hand pump, buckets,

8 brooms, and a small ladder; today, the department includes more

9 than 400 personnel who are committed to protecting a population of

10 over 250,000 people across 68 square miles; the agency's first

11 responders operate out of 13 stations, utilizing a fleet of 13

12 engines, 5 trucks, and 11 ambulances; and

WHEREAS, Over the decades, the Irving Fire Department has

14 expanded its services to include EMS capabilities as well as teams

15 specializing in swift-water rescue, hazardous materials, and

16 technical rescue; in addition, the department established the

17 Public Education Station in 2004, and it trains new recruits at the

18 Joint Training Facility, a collaborative effort between the Cities

19 of Irving and Grand Prairie; the department has implemented a

20 comprehensive mental health and wellness program for its personnel,

21 and it also works to connect the general public to mental health

22 resources; and

23 WHEREAS, The Irving Fire Department has further served the

24 community through initiatives such as the Blue Christmas program,

- 1 the Citizens Fire Academy, CPR demonstrations, cancer awareness
- 2 campaigns, and the Supplies for Success Drive, which benefits area
- 3 students; among its many achievements, the department received an
- 4 Insurance Services Office Class 1 rating, which indicates it is
- 5 among the top one percent of fire departments in the nation for
- 6 capabilities and standards; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Throughout the past century, the courageous members
- 8 of the Irving Fire Department have dedicated themselves to
- 9 protecting the lives and property of their fellow citizens, and
- 10 this milestone anniversary offers a fitting opportunity for area
- 11 residents to express their appreciation to the department for its
- 12 outstanding service; now, therefore, be it
