A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a groundwater study of certain aquifers underlying the
3	territory of the Neches and Trinity Valleys Groundwater
4	Conservation District by the Texas Water Development Board before
5	the issuance of permits or permit amendments by the district.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 8863, Special District
8	Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Section 8863.106 to read as
9	follows:
10	Sec. 8863.106. STUDY; PERMIT MORATORIUM. (a) The Texas
11	Water Development Board shall conduct a study to:
12	(1) analyze the annual maximum amount of groundwater
13	that can be produced in perpetuity in the district from the
14	aquifers underlying the district's territory without impeding the
15	achievement of the desired future conditions adopted for those
16	aquifers that are applicable to the territory of the district;
17	(2) compare the results of the analyses conducted
18	under Subdivision (1) to the amount of modeled available
19	groundwater determined by the executive administrator of the Texas
20	Water Development Board before September 1, 2025, for each aquifer;
21	<u>and</u>
22	(3) assess the hydrological effects in the district of
23	proposed groundwater production in the district as represented in
24	the applicable desired future conditions, and of transfers of

- 1 produced groundwater to areas outside of the district proposed in
- 2 any pending applications for a permit or permit amendment from the
- 3 district, and compare those effects with the hydrological effects
- 4 that would be expected if groundwater production in the district
- 5 were limited annually to the amount that could be produced in
- 6 perpetuity as determined under Subdivision (1).
- 7 (b) The hydrological effects assessed under Subsection
- 8 (a)(3) must include effects on average annual recharge, inflows,
- 9 discharges, spring flows, capture, and interaction between
- 10 groundwater and surface water in the district.
- 11 (c) Not later than January 12, 2027, the Texas Water
- 12 Development Board shall prepare and submit to the governor, the
- 13 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 14 and each standing legislative committee with primary jurisdiction
- 15 over groundwater a report on the results of the study conducted
- 16 <u>under this section</u>.
- 17 (d) The district may not issue a new permit or permit
- 18 amendment to an applicant for the production and transfer out of the
- 19 district of groundwater until after the 270th day after the
- 20 <u>deadline for the submission of the report required by Subsection</u>
- 21 <u>(c)</u>.
- (e) This section expires November 1, 2027.
- SECTION 2. Section 8863.106(d), Special District Local Laws
- 24 Code, as added by this Act, does not apply to a permit or a permit
- 25 amendment issued by the Neches and Trinity Valleys Groundwater
- 26 Conservation District before the effective date of this Act.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 5 legislative session.
