Sec. 51.552. RULES. The commission shall adopt rules 15 16 necessary to implement this subchapter. The rules must establish 17 procedures for: 18 (1) the department to determine whether the licensing requirements of another state are substantially equivalent to the 19 requirements of this state, taking into consideration: 20 21 (A) the level of required training and testing to obtain a license, including methods used to evaluate work 22 23 experience to fulfill training or testing requirements; 24 (B) the scope of practice for which the license

10	odd-numbered year, the department shall submit to the governor and
11	the Legislative Budget Board a written report that:
12	(1) summarizes the department's efforts under Section

14	licensing requirements exceed the requirements of other states;
15	(2) describes the department's efforts to enter into
16	reciprocity agreements with licensing authorities in other states,
17	including a list of:
18	(A) each reciprocity agreement entered into; and

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Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt the rules
 required by Section 51.552, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Section 51.553, Occupations
 Code, as added by this Act, the Texas Department of Licensing and

Regulation shall submit the initial report required by that section

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not later than December 1, 2027.
SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
