A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to courses in personal financial literacy and economics
3	for high school students in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
8	grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:
9	(1) a foundation curriculum that includes:
10	(A) English language arts;
11	(B) mathematics;
12	(C) science; and
13	(D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United
14	States, and world history, government, personal financial
15	<u>literacy</u> , economics, with emphasis on the free enterprise system
16	and its benefits, and geography; and
17	(2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:
18	(A) to the extent possible, languages other than
19	English;
20	(B) health, with emphasis on:
21	(i) physical health, including the
22	importance of proper nutrition and exercise;
23	(ii) mental health, including instruction
2/1	about mental health conditions substance abuse skills to manage

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1 emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and
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- 2 responsible decision-making; and
- 3 (iii) suicide prevention, including
- 4 recognizing suicide-related risk factors and warning signs;
- 5 (C) physical education;
- 6 (D) fine arts;
- 7 (E) career and technology education;
- 8 (F) technology applications; and
- 9 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
- 10 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
- 11 history and literature [; and
- [(H) personal financial literacy].
- SECTION 2. Section 28.0021(b), Education Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (b) Each school district and each open-enrollment charter
- 16 school that offers a high school program shall provide a [an
- 17 elective] course in personal financial literacy that meets the
- 18 requirements for a one-half social studies [elective] credit under
- 19 Section 28.025, using materials approved by the State Board of
- 20 Education. The instruction in personal financial literacy must
- 21 include instruction on completing the application for federal
- 22 student aid provided by the United States Department of Education.
- 23 In fulfilling the requirement to provide financial literacy
- 24 instruction under this section, a school district or
- 25 open-enrollment charter school may use an existing state, federal,
- 26 private, or nonprofit program that provides students without charge
- 27 the instruction described under this section.

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- 1 SECTION 3. Sections 28.025(b-1) and (b-23), Education Code,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 4 that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school
- 5 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students
- 6 successfully complete:
- 7 (1) four credits in English language arts under
- 8 Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one
- 9 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in
- 10 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 11 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section
- 12 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in
- 13 geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course
- 14 authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 15 (3) three credits in science under Section
- 16 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any
- 17 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one
- 18 credit in integrated physics and chemistry or in an additional
- 19 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 20 (4) three credits in social studies under Section
- 21 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at
- 22 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in
- 23 [economics or] personal financial literacy [& economics], and one
- 24 credit in economics, world geography, or world history;
- 25 (5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12),
- 26 (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language
- 27 other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);

- 1 (6) five elective credits;
- 2 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section
- 3 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
- 4 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
- 5 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- 6 (b-23) The agency shall:
- 7 (1) develop a list of free, open-source, and publicly
- 8 available curricula that may be used by a school district to provide
- 9 a personal financial literacy [& economics] course that satisfies
- 10 the curriculum requirement under Subsection (b-1)(4); and
- 11 (2) seek, accept, and spend any federal or private
- 12 grant funds and gifts that are available for the purpose of
- 13 providing a personal financial literacy [& economics] course as
- 14 part of the foundation high school program.
- SECTION 4. Section 28.025(b-22), Education Code, is
- 16 repealed.
- 17 SECTION 5. Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1), Education
- 18 Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to students entering the
- 19 ninth grade during the 2025-2026 school year or a later school year.
- 20 For students entering a grade above ninth grade during the
- 21 2025-2026 school year, Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1),
- 22 Education Code, as those sections existed before amendment by this
- 23 Act, apply, and those sections are continued in effect for that
- 24 purpose.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 26 school year.
- 27 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
