3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
5	adding Subchapter K to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER K. FIRST RESPONDER PEER SUPPORT NETWORK
7	Sec. 418.351. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Emergency medical services personnel" has the
9	meaning assigned by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code.
10	(2) "Firefighter" means a firefighter who is a
11	permanent, paid employee of the fire department of a political
12	subdivision. The term does not include a volunteer firefighter.
13	(3) "First responder" means emergency medical
14	services personnel or a firefighter.
15	(4) "Peer" means a person who is a first responder or
16	retired first responder.
17	Sec. 418.352. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The division
18	shall develop a first responder peer support network. The network
19	<pre>must include:</pre>
20	(1) peer-to-peer support;
21	(2) training for peer service coordinators and peers
22	that includes suicide prevention training;
23	(3) technical assistance for program development,
24	peer service coordinators, licensed mental health professionals,

- 1 and peers; and
- 2 (4) identification, retention, and screening of
- 3 licensed mental health professionals.
- 4 (b) As part of the first responder peer support network, the
- 5 division:
- 6 (1) shall ensure first responders have support in both
- 7 urban and rural jurisdictions through the establishment of regional
- 8 peer support hubs; and
- 9 (2) may establish a program to connect first
- 10 responders with clinical resources at no cost to the first
- 11 responders.
- 12 (c) The division shall solicit and ensure that specialized
- 13 training is provided to persons who are peers and who want to
- 14 provide peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer services under
- 15 <u>the network.</u>
- Sec. 418.353. CONFIDENTIALITY OF PARTICIPANT INFORMATION.
- 17 Information relating to a first responder's participation in
- 18 peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer services under the
- 19 network is confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter
- 20 552.
- Sec. 418.354. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 22 <u>each year, the division shall submit a report to the governor and</u>
- 23 <u>the legislature that includes:</u>
- 24 (1) the number of first responders who received peer
- 25 support through the network;
- 26 (2) the number of peers and peer service coordinators
- 27 trained, including the number of active peers and peer service

- 1 coordinators and the retention rate of peers and peer service
- 2 coordinators;
- 3 (3) the number of vacant regional director positions
- 4 and the average length of time each position has been vacant;
- 5 (4) the number and types of community engagement
- 6 events and outreach activities hosted by the network to promote
- 7 first responder awareness and use of the network;
- 8 (5) the number of critical incident responses and
- 9 wellness interventions facilitated by the network;
- 10 (6) an evaluation of the services provided under this
- 11 subchapter; and
- 12 (7) recommendations for program improvements.
- SECTION 2. Section 419.036, Government Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows:
- 15 (e) The commission may not take disciplinary action against
- 16 a regulated person based on the person's participation in
- 17 peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer services and may not
- 18 consider the person's participation during any disciplinary
- 19 proceeding under this chapter.
- SECTION 3. Section 773.061, Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 22 (f) The department may not take disciplinary action against
- 23 <u>a person described by Subsection (a)(1) based on the person's</u>
- 24 participation in peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer
- 25 services and may not consider the person's participation during any
- 26 disciplinary proceeding under this chapter.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
