15	(4) "Peer" means a person who is a first responder or		
16	retired first responder.		
17	Sec. 418.352. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The division		
18	shall develop a first responder peer support network. The network		
19	<pre>must include:</pre>		
20	(1) peer-to-peer support;		
21	(2) training for peer service coordinators and peers		
22	that includes suicide prevention training;		
23	(3) technical assistance for program development and		
24	<pre>implementation; and</pre>

- 3 (b) As part of the first responder peer support network, the

- 5 (1) shall ensure first responders have support in both

- 16 Information relating to a first responder's participation in

- Sec. 418.354. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 21 each year, the division shall submit a report to the governor and
- 22 <u>the legislature that includes:</u>
- 23 (1) the number of first responders who received peer
- 24 support through the network;
- 25 (2) the number of peers trained, the number of first
- 26 responders the peers served, and the retention rate of peers;
- 27 (3) the number and location of regional network

- 3 to by the network;
- 4 (5) an evaluation of the services provided under this

- 9 (e) The commission may not take disciplinary action against
- 10 a regulated person based on the person's participation in
- 11 peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer services and may not
- 12 consider the person's participation during any disciplinary
- 13 proceeding under this chapter.
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 773.061, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 16 (f) The department may not take disciplinary action against
- 17 a person described by Subsection (a)(1) based on the person's
- 18 participation in peer-to-peer support and other peer-to-peer
- 19 services and may not consider the person's participation during any
- 20 disciplinary proceeding under this chapter.
- SECTION 4. Not later than March 31, 2026, the Texas Division
- 22 of Emergency Management shall develop the first responder peer
- 23 support network required by Subchapter K, Chapter 418, Government
- 24 Code, as added by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 5. The Texas Division of Emergency Management is
- 26 required to implement this Act only if the legislature appropriates
- 27 money specifically for that purpose. If the legislature does not

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- 1 appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the division may,
- 2 but is not required to, implement this Act using other
- 3 appropriations available for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
