## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to perinatal bereavement care provided by certain
3	hospitals, a perinatal bereavement care initiative, and a perinatal
4	bereavement care hospital recognition program.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle G, Title 4, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 328 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 328. PERINATAL BEREAVEMENT CARE SERVICES
9	Sec. 328.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
11	Services.
12	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
13	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
14	(3) "Hospital" means a hospital licensed under Chapter
15	<u>241.</u>
16	(4) "Initiative" means the perinatal bereavement care
17	initiative established under Section 328.003.
18	(5) "Perinatal bereavement care" means the provision
19	of supportive care for a prenatal diagnosis of a life-limiting
20	fetal condition.
21	(6) "Perinatal bereavement device" means a device with
22	technology capable of delaying for bereavement purposes the
23	deterioration of human tissue for up to 72 hours following an
24	intrauterine fetal demise, neonatal death, or stillbirth.

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1	(7) "Recognition program" means the hospital
2	recognition program established under Section 328.004.
3	Sec. 328.002. PERINATAL BEREAVEMENT CARE SERVICES REQUIRED
4	IN CERTAIN HOSPITALS. A hospital assigned a maternal level of care
5	designation under Section 241.182 shall, following an intrauterine
6	fetal demise, neonatal death, or stillbirth, make available to the
7	expectant parents and family members for a period equal to the
8	length of stay recommended by a medical professional for a birth:
9	(1) perinatal bereavement care counseling options;
10	and
11	(2) any available perinatal bereavement device.
12	Sec. 328.003. PERINATAL BEREAVEMENT CARE INITIATIVE. (a)
13	The department shall establish and administer a perinatal
14	bereavement care initiative to improve access to and quality of
15	perinatal bereavement care in this state.
16	(b) Under the initiative, the department may provide to
17	hospitals assigned a maternal level of care designation under
18	Section 241.182 the following resources for the hospital's
19	provision of perinatal bereavement care:
20	(1) for hospital personnel who provide maternal care,
21	training on interacting with parents and family members in a
22	considerate and respectful manner following an intrauterine fetal
23	demise, neonatal death, or stillbirth;
24	(2) a perinatal bereavement device, including:
25	(A) training for personnel on the use of the
26	device; and
27	(B) support to maintain the device; and

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1	(3) any other resources necessary for providing
2	perinatal bereavement care.
3	(c) In providing resources to hospitals under the
4	initiative, the department shall prioritize hospitals that:
5	(1) lack access to a perinatal bereavement device;
6	(2) treat a greater number of high-risk maternal
7	patients; and
8	(3) deliver a greater number of babies.
9	(d) The department, as appropriate and using money
10	appropriated or otherwise available for that purpose, may award
11	grants under the initiative to hospitals assigned a maternal level
12	of care designation under Section 241.182 to increase access to
13	perinatal bereavement care resources.
14	(e) The department may accept gifts, grants, and donations
15	from any source for the purposes of the initiative.
16	Sec. 328.004. HOSPITAL RECOGNITION PROGRAM. The executive
17	commissioner, in collaboration with the Perinatal Advisory Council
18	established under Section 241.187, shall:
19	(1) develop and implement a program to recognize
20	hospitals assigned a maternal level of care designation under
21	Section 241.182 that provide perinatal bereavement care training to
22	hospital personnel; and
23	(2) adopt criteria for awarding recognition to a
24	hospital under the recognition program.
25	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
26	of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
27	Services Commission may adopt the rules necessary to implement

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Chapter 328, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
