A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the establishment of the sickle cell disease registry.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Chapter 52B to read as follows:
CHAPTER 52B. SICKLE CELL DISEASE REGISTRY

In this chapter, "health<u>care</u> 52B.001. DEFINITION. facility" means:

(1) a hospital licensed under Chapter 241; or

(2) any other facility that provides diagnostic or treatment services to patients with sickle cell disease.

Sec. 52B.002. REGISTRY; CONTENTS. (a) The department establish and maintain a sickle cell disease registry in accordance with this chapter for use as a single repository of accurate, complete records of sickle cell disease cases to aid the cure and treatment of sickle cell disease in this state.

The sickle cell disease registry must include: (b)

a record of sickle cell disease cases that occur in (1)this state; and

(2) any other information concerning sickle cell disease cases the executive commissioner considers necessary and appropriate to assist with the cure or treatment of sickle cell

Sec. 52B.003. DATA FROM HEALTH CARE FACILITIES. A health care facility shall provide to the department, in the form and manner the department prescribes, data the department considers A health necessary and appropriate concerning sickle cell disease cases.

Sec. 52B.004. DEPARTMENT POWERS; RULES. (a) To implement this chapter, the department may:
(1) execute necessar

execute necessary contracts; receive data from health facilities care concerning sickle cell disease cases to record and analyze the data directly related to the disease; and

(3) compile and publish statistical and other studies derived from data obtained under this chapter to provide, in an accessible form, information useful to physicians, other medical personnel, and the public.

The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to (b) implement this chapter.

The executive commissioner by rule shall deve<u>lop</u> guidelines to:

(1)obtain data from health care facilities regarding sickle cell disease cases;
