(c) [(b)] The commission [department] shall solicit and 18 ensure that specialized training is provided to persons who are 19 peers and who want to provide peer-to-peer counseling or other 20 peer-to-peer services under the program. 21 22 [(c) The executive commissioner may adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter.] 23 24 SECTION 1.03. Sections 434.352(b) and (f), Government Code, 25 are amended to read as follows: (b) For the mental health program for veterans, 26 the commission shall: 27

(1) provide training to peer service coordinators and
 peers in accordance with Section 434.353;

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3 (2) provide technical assistance to peer service4 coordinators and peers;

5 (3) identify, train, and communicate with 6 community-based licensed mental health professionals, 7 community-based organizations, and faith-based organizations;

8 (4) coordinate services for justice involved9 veterans;

10 (5) coordinate local delivery to veterans and 11 immediate family members of veterans of mental health first aid for 12 veterans training; and

13 (6) employ and train mental health professionals to 14 assist [the Health and Human Services Commission] in the 15 administration of the program.

16 (f) The commission [and the Department of State Health 17 Services] shall [jointly] verify that each state agency authorized 18 to award a grant subject to the requirements of Subsection (e) has 19 adopted policies to ensure compliance with Subsection (e).

20 SECTION 1.04. Section 1001.224, Health and Safety Code, is 21 transferred to Subchapter H, Chapter 434, Government Code, 22 redesignated as Section 434.354, Government Code, and amended to 23 read as follows:

Sec. <u>434.354</u> [1001.224]. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each year, the <u>commission</u> [department] shall submit a report to the governor and the legislature that includes:

Subchapter H, Chapter 434, Government Code, 8 is amended by adding Section 434.355 to read as follows: 9 Sec. 434.355. RULES. The commission may adopt rules to 10 administer this subchapter. ARTICLE 2. TRANSFER OF TEXAS VETERANS AND FAMILY ALLIANCE GRANT 11 12 PROGRAM Subchapter G, Chapter 547, Government Code, SECTION 2.01. 13 14 is transferred to Chapter 434, Government Code, redesignated as 15 Subchapter J, Government Code, and amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER J [G]. MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM FOR COMMUNITY MENTAL 16 17 HEALTH PROGRAMS ASSISTING VETERANS AND THEIR FAMILIES Sec. 434.421 [547.0301]. DEFINITIONS [DEFINITION]. In this 18 19 subchapter: "Commission" means the Texas Veterans Commission. 20 (1)21 "Executive director" means the executive director (2) of the commission or the executive director's designee. 22 (3) "Matching [, "matching] grant program" means the 23 24 matching grant program established under this subchapter. Sec. 434.422 [547.0302]. MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM. 25 To the 26 extent funds are appropriated to the commission for that purpose, the commission shall establish a matching grant program to support 27

3 Sec. <u>434.423</u> [547.0303]. MATCHING CONTRIBUTIONS REQUIRED. 4 (a) The commission shall ensure that each grant recipient obtains 5 or secures contributions to match a grant awarded to the recipient 6 in amounts of money or other consideration as required by Section 7 434.424 [547.0304] or 434.425 [547.0305].

8 (b) The money or other consideration obtained or secured by 9 the commission may, as the executive <u>director</u> [commissioner] 10 determines, include cash or in-kind contributions from private 11 contributors or local governments but may not include state or 12 federal funds.

13 Sec. <u>434.424</u> [547.0304]. MATCHING GRANT CONDITIONS: SINGLE 14 COUNTIES. For services and treatment provided in a single county, 15 the commission shall condition each grant provided under this 16 subchapter on a potential grant recipient providing funds from 17 non-state sources in a total amount at least equal to:

(1) 25 percent of the grant amount if the community mental health program to be supported by the grant provides services and treatment in a county with a population of less than 100,000;

(2) 50 percent of the grant amount if the community
mental health program to be supported by the grant provides
services and treatment in a county with a population of 100,000 or
more but less than 250,000; or

(3) 100 percent of the grant amount if the community27 mental health program to be supported by the grant provides

1 services and treatment in a county with a population of 250,000 or 2 more.

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3 Sec. <u>434.425</u> [547.0305]. MATCHING GRANT CONDITIONS: 4 MULTIPLE COUNTIES. For a community mental health program that 5 provides services and treatment in more than one county, the 6 commission shall condition each grant provided under this 7 subchapter on a potential grant recipient providing funds from 8 non-state sources in a total amount at least equal to:

9 (1) 25 percent of the grant amount if the county with 10 the largest population in which the community mental health program 11 to be supported by the grant provides services and treatment has a 12 population of less than 100,000;

(2) 50 percent of the grant amount if the county with the largest population in which the community mental health program to be supported by the grant provides services and treatment has a population of 100,000 or more but less than 250,000; or

(3) 100 percent of the grant amount if the county with the largest population in which the community mental health program to be supported by the grant provides services and treatment has a population of 250,000 or more.

21 Sec. <u>434.426</u> [547.0306]. SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS; 22 APPLICATIONS AND PROPOSALS. (a) The commission shall select grant 23 recipients based on the submission of applications or proposals by 24 nonprofit and governmental entities.

(b) The executive <u>director</u> [commissioner] shall develop criteria for evaluating the applications or proposals and the selection of grant recipients. The selection criteria must:

1 (1) evaluate and score: 2 (A) fiscal controls for the project; 3 (B) project effectiveness; (C) project cost; and 4 5 (D) an applicant's previous experience with grants and contracts; 6 7 address the possibility of and method for making (2) 8 multiple awards; and 9 (3) include other factors that the executive director [commissioner] considers relevant. 10 Sec. 434.427 [547.0307]. USE OF GRANTS AND 11 MATCHING 12 AMOUNTS. A grant awarded under the matching grant program must be used for the sole purpose of supporting community mental health 13 14 programs that: 15 (1)provide mental health services and treatment to 16 veterans and their families; and (2) coordinate mental health services for veterans and 17 their families with other transition support services. 18 Sec. 434.428 [547.0308]. DISTRIBUTING 19 AND ALLOCATING APPROPRIATED MONEY. (a) As the executive <u>director</u> [commissioner] 20 21 authorizes, the commission shall disburse money appropriated to or obtained by the commission for the matching grant program directly 22 23 to grant recipients. 24 (b) The commission may use a reasonable amount not to exceed 25 five percent of the money appropriated by the legislature for the

26 purposes of this subchapter to pay the administrative costs of 27 implementing this subchapter.

Sec. 434.429 [547.0309]. RULES. The commission [executive 1 commissioner] shall adopt rules necessary to implement the matching 2 3 grant program.

4 ARTICLE 3. TRANSFER OF VETERAN SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTION PLAN 5 SECTION 3.01. Chapter 434, Government Code, is amended by adding Subchapter K to read as follows: 6

SUBCHAPTER K. VETERAN SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTION PLAN

Sec. 434.451. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "commission" 8 means the Texas Veterans Commission. 9

10 SECTION 3.02. Section 547.0004, Government Code, is transferred to Subchapter K, Chapter 434, Government Code, as added 11 12 by this Act, redesignated as Section 434.452, Government Code, and amended to read as follows: 13

Sec. 434.452 [547.0004]. VETERAN SUICIDE PREVENTION ACTION 14 15 PLAN. (a) The commission, in collaboration with the Texas Coordinating Council for Veterans Services, the United States 16 17 Department of Veterans Affairs, the Service Members, Veterans, and their Families Technical Assistance Center Implementation Academy 18 of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration of 19 the United States Department of Health and Human Services, veteran 20 advocacy groups, health care providers, and any other organization 21 or interested party the commission considers appropriate, shall 22 23 develop a comprehensive action plan to increase access to and 24 availability of professional veteran health services to prevent veteran suicides. 25

The action plan must:

(1)

identify opportunities for raising awareness of

1 and providing resources for veteran suicide prevention;

2 (2) identify opportunities to increase access to
3 veteran mental health services;

4 (3) identify funding resources to provide accessible,
5 affordable veteran mental health services;

6 (4) provide measures to expand public-private 7 partnerships to ensure access to quality, timely mental health 8 services;

9 (5) provide for proactive outreach measures to reach 10 veterans needing care;

(6) provide for peer-to-peer service coordination, including training, certification, recertification, and continuing education for peer coordinators; and

14 (7) address suicide prevention awareness, measures,15 and training regarding veterans involved in the justice system.

16 (c) The commission shall make specific long-term statutory, 17 administrative, and budget-related recommendations to the legislature and the governor regarding the policy initiatives and 18 19 reforms necessary to implement the action plan developed under this section. The initiatives and reforms in the long-term plan must be 20 fully implemented by September 1, 2027. 21

(d) The commission shall include in the commission's strategic plan under Chapter 2056 the plans for implementing the long-term recommendations under Subsection (c).

(e) This <u>subchapter</u> [section] expires September 1, 2027.
 ARTICLE 4. REPEALER; TRANSITIONS; EFFECTIVE DATE
 SECTION 4.01. The following provisions are repealed:

(1) Section 434.352(a), Government Code;

2 (2) the heading to Subchapter I, Chapter 1001, Health3 and Safety Code;

(3) Section 1001.221, Health and Safety Code; and

(4) Section 1001.225, Health and Safety Code.

6 SECTION 4.02. (a) On the effective date of this Act, the 7 following are transferred from the Health and Human Services 8 Commission to the Texas Veterans Commission:

9 (1) the powers, duties, functions, programs, and 10 activities of the Health and Human Services Commission relating to 11 the mental health programs under Subchapters H, J, and K, Chapter 12 434, Government Code, as redesignated by this Act;

13 (2) any obligations and contracts of the Health and 14 Human Services Commission that are directly related to a power, 15 duty, function, program, or activity transferred under this Act; 16 and

(3) all property and records in the custody of the Health and Human Services Commission that are related to a power, duty, function, program, or activity transferred under this Act and all funds appropriated by the legislature for that power, duty, function, program, or activity.

(b) The Health and Human Services Commission and the Texas Veterans Commission shall establish a plan for the transfer of personnel whose functions predominantly involve a power, duty, function, program, or activity transferred under this Act.

26 SECTION 4.03. It is the intent of the 89th Legislature, 27 Regular Session, 2025, that Sections 434.424 and 434.425,

Government Code, as redesignated by this Act from Sections 547.0304 and 547.0305, Government Code, respectively, be harmonized with S.B. No. 897 or another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, relating to the administration of a grant program to support community mental health programs assisting veterans and their families, with respect to the percentage of funds from non-state sources that a potential grant recipient must provide. SECTION 4.04. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
