1 in the storing of aquatic species including but not limited to 2 shrimp, other crustaceans, finfish, mollusks, and other similar 3 creatures;

(13) tangible personal property incorporated into or attached to a structure that is located on a commercial dairy farm, is used or employed exclusively for the production of milk, and is:

(A) a free-stall dairy barn; or
(B) a dairy structure used solely for maternity

26 (14) telecommunications services exclusively provided27 or used for the navigation of machinery and equipment exclusively

1 used or employed on a farm or ranch in the building or maintaining 2 of roads or water facilities or in the production of: 3 (A) food for human consumption; 4 (B) grass;

6 (D) other agricultural products to be sold in the
7 regular course of business;

8 (15) exotic animals, as defined by Section 23.51; and

11 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not 12 affect tax liability accruing before the effective date of this 13 Act. That liability continues in effect as if this Act had not been 14 enacted, and the former law is continued in effect for the 15 collection of taxes due and for civil and criminal enforcement of 16 the liability for those taxes.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
