A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to periodic health screenings for firefighters.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. This Act may be cited as the Wade Cannon Act.
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 180, Local Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 180.011 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 180.011. OCCUPATIONAL CANCER SCREENING FOR
8	FIREFIGHTERS. (a) In this section, "firefighter" means an
9	individual defined as fire protection personnel under Section
10	419.021, Government Code.
11	(b) A political subdivision that employs firefighters shall
12	offer an occupational cancer screening to each firefighter at no
13	cost to the firefighter in the fifth year of the firefighter's
14	employment, and once every year following the initial screening.
15	(c) The occupational cancer screening offered under
16	Subsection (b) must be confidential, and in addition to testing for
17	<pre>cancer, include:</pre>
18	(1) a urine test;
19	(2) a pulmonary function test;
20	(3) an electrocardiogram;
21	(4) an infectious disease screening;
22	(5) a breast cancer screening;
23	(6) a blood test; and
24	(7) subject to Subsection (d), a chest x-ray.

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(d) A firefighter is eligible to receive a chest x-ray 1 2 during the screening under this section once every five years. (e) The Texas Commission on Fire Protection shall adopt 3 rules establishing minimum standards for the screening under this 4 5 section using standards developed by the National Fire Protection 6 Association. 7 (f) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a political subdivision that employs firefighters is not required to offer a screening 8 9 under this section if the political subdivision offers an annual occupational medical examination under a plan submitted to the 10 Texas Commission on Fire Protection no later than February 1 of each 11 year. The plan must be endorsed by a physician and be in 12 substantial compliance with standards developed by the National 13 Fire Protection Association. The Texas Commission on Fire 14 15 Protection shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. 16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2026.
