A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the permissible uses of the school safety allotment 3 under the Foundation School Program. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 48.115(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Funds allocated under this section must be used to 7 (b) improve school safety and security, including costs associated 8 9 with: securing school facilities in accordance with the 10 (1)11 requirements of Section 37.351, including: 12 (A) improvements to school infrastructure; 13 (B) the use or installation of perimeter security 14 fencing conducive to a public school learning environment or physical barriers, which may not include razor wire; 15 (C) exterior door and window safety and security 16 upgrades, including exterior door numbering and locking systems and 17 security film that provides resistance to a forced entry; and 18 19 the purchase and maintenance of: (D) 20 (i) security cameras and, if the district 21 has already installed security cameras, other security equipment, 22 including video surveillance as provided by Section 29.022; and 23 (ii) technology, including communications 24 systems or devices, such as silent panic alert devices, two-way

No. 222 radios, or wireless Internet booster equipment, that facilitates 1 communication and information sharing between students, school 2 3 personnel, and first responders in an emergency; (2) providing security for the district, including: 4 5 (A) employing school district peace officers, private security officers, and school marshals; and 6 7 collaborating with local law enforcement (B) 8 agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the 9 district; 10 (3) school safety and security measures, including: 11 12 (A) active shooter and emergency response 13 training; 14 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating 15 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and 16 (C) the prevention, identification, and 17 management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based, effective prevention practices and including: 18 19 (i) providing licensed counselors, social and individuals trained in restorative 20 workers, chaplains, discipline and restorative justice practices; 21 (ii) providing mental health personnel and 22 23 support, including chaplains; 24 (iii) providing behavioral health 25 services, including services provided by chaplains; 26 (iv) establishing threat reporting systems; [and] 27

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1 (v) providing professional development for 2 educators that includes training in classroom behavioral 3 management; and 4 (vi) developing and implementing programs focused on restorative justice practices, culturally relevant 5 instruction, and providing mental health support, including 6 support provided by chaplains; 7 8 (4) providing programs related to suicide prevention, 9 intervention, and postvention, including programs provided by 10 chaplains; and 11 (5) employing a school safety director and other personnel to manage and monitor school safety initiatives and the 12 implementation of school safety requirements for the district. 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025. 14

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
