1 AN ACT 2 relating to competitive requirements for a procurement by a municipality for lobbying, government relations, or similar 3 services. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 252.022(a), Local Government Code, is 6 7 amended to read as follows: (a) This chapter does not apply to an expenditure for: 8 9 (1) a procurement made because of a public calamity that requires the immediate appropriation of money to relieve the 10 necessity of the municipality's residents or to preserve the 11 property of the municipality; 12 13 (2) a procurement necessary to preserve or protect the 14 public health or safety of the municipality's residents; 15 (3) a procurement necessary because of unforeseen 16 damage to public machinery, equipment, or other property; 17 (4) a procurement for personal, professional, or planning services, other than lobbying, government relations, or 18 similar services intended to influence state or federal lawmakers 19 on behalf of a municipality; 20 21 (5) a procurement for work that is performed and paid 22 for by the day as the work progresses; 23 (6) a purchase of land or a right-of-way; 24 (7) a procurement of items that are available from

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1 only one source, including: items that are available from only one source 2 (A) 3 because of patents, copyrights, secret processes, or natural monopolies; 4 5 (B) films, manuscripts, or books; 6 (C) gas, water, and other utility services; 7 captive replacement parts or components for (D) 8 equipment; books, papers, and other library materials 9 (E) 10 for a public library that are available only from the persons holding exclusive distribution rights to the materials; and 11 12 (F) management services provided by a nonprofit organization to a municipal museum, park, zoo, or other facility to 13 14 which the organization has provided significant financial or other 15 benefits; 16 (8) a purchase of rare books, papers, and other 17 library materials for a public library; (9) paving drainage, street widening, and other public 18 improvements, or related matters, if at least one-third of the cost 19 is to be paid by or through special assessments levied on property 20 that will benefit from the improvements; 21 improvement project, 22 (10)а public already in progress, authorized by the voters of the municipality, for which 23 24 there is a deficiency of funds for completing the project in accordance with the plans and purposes authorized by the voters; 25 26 (11)a payment under a contract by which a developer 27 participates in the construction of a public improvement as
