A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a border crime property damage compensation program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 56C, Code of Criminal 4 Procedure, is amended to read as follows: 5 6 CHAPTER 56C. BORDER CRIME [LANDOWNER COMPENSATION FOR] PROPERTY DAMAGE COMPENSATION PROGRAM [CAUSED BY CERTAIN CRIMINAL 7 ACTIVITIES] 8 SECTION 2. Article 56C.001(2), Code of Criminal Procedure, 9 is amended to read as follows: 10 "Border crime" means conduct: 11 (2) 12 (A) constituting an offense under: 13 (i) Subchapter D, Chapter 481, Health and 14 Safety Code; Section 20.05, 20.06, or 38.04, Penal (ii) 15 Code; or 16 (iii) Chapter 20A, Penal Code; and 17 18 (B) involving transnational criminal activity. SECTION 3. Article 56C.003, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 21 Art. 56C.003. BORDER CRIME PROPERTY DAMAGE [LANDOWNER] 22 COMPENSATION PROGRAM. (a) From the funding sources described by 23 Subsection (a-1) [money appropriated for the purpose], the attorney general shall establish and administer a program to compensate 24

No. 246 landowners and lessees who suffer [real property] damage to 1 agricultural land, including buildings or other improvements, or to 2 livestock, timber, or crops on agricultural land, caused by: 3 4 (1) a trespasser as a result of an offense under Chapter 28, Penal Code, that was committed in the course of or in 5 furtherance of a border crime; or 6 7 (2) a law enforcement response to a trespasser who was 8 engaged in a border crime. 9 (a-1) The attorney general may use money from the following sources to establish the program described by Subsection (a): 10 (1) money appropriated, credited, or transferred by 11 12 the legislature for purposes of the program; (2) revenue that the legislature by statute dedicates 13 14 for deposit to the credit of the program; and 15 (3) gifts, grants, and donations received by the state for purposes of the program, including grants and reimbursements 16 17 received from the federal government. (b) The attorney general shall establish: 18 19 (1)a standardized form and report template to be used by law enforcement agencies for the purpose of documenting damage 20 caused by a trespasser in accordance with Subsection (c); 21 22 (2) eligibility criteria for compensation under this article, including requirements for providing proof of eligibility 23 24 for compensation; 25 (3) [(2)] application procedures; (4) [(3)] criteria for evaluating applications and 26 27 awarding compensation;

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1 (5) [(4)] guidelines related to compensation amounts, 2 provided that the maximum amount awarded per incident causing 3 damage may not exceed <u>a total of</u> \$75,000 <u>and any portion of damages</u> 4 <u>attributable to livestock, timber, or crops may not exceed \$10,000;</u> 5 and

6 <u>(6)</u> [(5)] procedures for monitoring the use of 7 compensation awarded under this article and ensuring compliance 8 with any conditions of the award.

9 <u>(b-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), damage caused to</u> 10 <u>agricultural land includes any debris, pollutants, or contaminants</u> 11 <u>left on the land during the applicable incident, and compensation</u> 12 <u>awarded under this article may include an amount necessary to clean</u> 13 <u>up the debris, pollutants, or contaminants to restore the soil to</u> 14 its agricultural use.

(c) The attorney general may not award compensation under this article for [real property] damage caused by a trespasser described by Subsection (a)(1) unless the damage is documented in a written report by a law enforcement agency as having occurred in connection with a border crime.

20 (c-1) For purposes of allowing the attorney general to 21 determine whether a person qualifies for an award of compensation 22 under this article and the extent of the damage, a law enforcement 23 agency that makes a written report described by Subsection (c) 24 shall release the report to the attorney general not later than the 25 14th day after the date the attorney general makes a request to the 26 agency for the report.

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(d) In awarding compensation under this article for [real

No. 246 property] damage caused by a trespasser described by Subsection 1 (a)(1), the attorney general may not consider the outcome of any 2 3 criminal prosecution arising out of: 4 (1) the offense under Chapter 28, Penal Code, as a 5 result of which the applicant suffered [property] damage; or 6 (2) the applicable offense listed in Article 56C.001(2)(A). 7 8 SECTION 4. Article 56C.006(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows: 9 The program established under Article 56C.003 is a payer 10 (a) of last resort for [real property] damage described by that 11 12 article. SECTION 5. Sections 552.132(a), (b), (c), and 13 (d), 14 Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 15 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), in this section, "crime victim or claimant" means: 16 17 (1) a victim or claimant under Chapter 56B, Code of Criminal Procedure, who has filed an application for compensation 18 19 under that chapter; or (2) a person who has filed an application for 20 compensation under Chapter 56C, Code of Criminal Procedure. 21 The following information held by [the crime victim's 22 (b) compensation division of] the attorney general's office 23 in 24 connection with an application for compensation under Chapter 56B or 56C, Code of Criminal Procedure, is confidential: 25 26 (1) the name, social security number, address, or 27 telephone number of a crime victim or claimant; or

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(2) any other information the disclosure of which
 would identify or tend to identify the crime victim or claimant.

3 (c) If the crime victim or claimant is awarded compensation 4 under Article 56B.103, [or] 56B.104, or 56C.003, Code of Criminal 5 Procedure, as of the date of the award of compensation, the name of 6 the crime victim or claimant and the amount of compensation awarded 7 to that crime victim or claimant are public information and are not 8 excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021.

9 (d) An employee of a governmental body who is also a victim under Chapter 56B, Code of Criminal Procedure, or has suffered 10 property damage for which the employee is eligible for compensation 11 under Chapter 56C of that code, regardless of whether the employee 12 has filed an application for compensation under the applicable 13 [that] chapter, may elect whether to allow public access to 14 15 information held by the attorney general's office or other governmental body that would identify or tend to identify the 16 17 employee [victim], including a photograph or other visual representation of the employee [victim]. An election under this 18 subsection must be made in writing on a form developed by the 19 governmental body, be signed by the employee, and be filed with the 20 governmental body before the third anniversary of the latest to 21 occur of one of the following: 22

(1) the date the crime was committed <u>or the property</u>
 <u>damage occurred</u>, as applicable;

25 (2) the date employment begins; or

26 (3) the date the governmental body develops the form27 and provides it to employees.

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SECTION 6. Section 2251.052, Insurance Code, is amended by
 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

3 <u>(a-1)</u> In setting rates, an insurer may not consider whether
4 a claim has been made by or on behalf of a policyholder in relation
5 to an event documented by a report described by Article 56C.003(c),
6 Code of Criminal Procedure.

7 SECTION 7. Article 56C.007, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
8 repealed.

SECTION 8. Chapter 56C, Code of Criminal Procedure, as 9 10 amended by this Act, applies only to compensation for damages incurred in connection with conduct constituting an offense 11 occurring on or after the effective date of this Act. Compensation 12 for damages incurred in connection with conduct constituting an 13 14 offense occurring before the effective date of this Act is governed 15 by the law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of 16 17 this section, conduct constituting an offense occurred before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 18 before that date. 19

20 SECTION 9. Section 2251.052(a-1), Insurance Code, as added 21 by this Act, applies only to an insurance policy that is delivered, 22 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2026. A 23 policy delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 24 2026, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 25 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 26 that purpose.

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
