A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Department of Public Safety performing rapid DNA
3	testing of certain individuals crossing the Texas-Mexico border.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 421, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter G to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER G. RAPID DNA TESTING OF CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS CROSSING
8	TEXAS-MEXICO BORDER
9	Sec. 421.121. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.
11	(2) "Rapid DNA test" means a process for developing a
12	DNA profile of an individual:
13	(A) based on a biological sample consisting of a
14	buccal swab of the individual; and
15	(B) without the need for human intervention in
16	the process or the use of facilities dedicated to performing DNA
17	analyses and testing.
18	Sec. 421.122. RAPID DNA TESTING PROGRAM; AGREEMENT. The
19	Department of Public Safety shall enter into an agreement with the
20	United States Department of Homeland Security on request to
21	establish a program for:
22	(1) performing rapid DNA tests of individuals who:
23	(A) enter into this state by crossing the
24	Texas-Mexico border;

- 1 (B) are detained or arrested by the Department of
- 2 Homeland Security; and
- 3 (C) the Department of Homeland Security has
- 4 reason to believe are misrepresenting the existence of a family
- 5 relationship between the individual and another individual
- 6 detained or arrested by the Department of Homeland Security; and
- 7 (2) promptly providing the results of the rapid DNA
- 8 tests to the Department of Homeland Security for use in the
- 9 enforcement of federal immigration laws.
- 10 Sec. 421.123. BIOLOGICAL SAMPLES TO BE DESTROYED. The
- 11 Department of Public Safety shall destroy the biological sample
- 12 used to perform a rapid DNA test under the agreement described by
- 13 Section 421.122 after performing the test and providing the
- 14 results.
- 15 Sec. 421.124. DATABASE OF PROFILES PROHIBITED. The
- 16 Department of Public Safety may not maintain a database of DNA
- 17 profiles developed through rapid DNA tests performed under an
- 18 agreement described by Section 421.122.
- 19 Sec. 421.125. REQUIRED PROVISIONS. The agreement described
- 20 by Section 421.122 must contain provisions that are substantially
- 21 similar to the duty under Section 421.123 and the prohibition under
- 22 Section 421.124.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
