## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to credit toward payment of fines and costs for certain

3 defendants.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Articles 43.09(a) and (k), Code of Criminal

Procedure, are amended to read as follows:

7 (a) When a defendant is convicted of a misdemeanor and the defendant's punishment is assessed at a pecuniary fine or is 8 confined in a jail after conviction of a felony for which a fine is 9 imposed, if the defendant is unable to pay the fine and costs 10 11 adjudged against the defendant, the defendant may for such time as 12 will satisfy the judgment be put to work in the county jail industries program, in the workhouse, or on the county farm, or 13 14 public improvements and maintenance projects of the county or a political subdivision located in whole or in part in the county, as 15 provided in Article 43.10; or if there is no such county jail 16 17 industries program, workhouse, farm, or improvements and maintenance projects, the defendant shall be confined in jail for a 18 sufficient length of time to discharge the full amount of fine and 19 costs adjudged against the defendant; rating such confinement at 20 \$150 [\$100] for each day and rating such labor at \$150 [\$100] for 21 each day; provided, however, that the defendant may pay the 22 23 pecuniary fine assessed against the defendant at any time while the defendant is serving at work in the county jail industries program, 24

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- 1 in the workhouse, or on the county farm, or on the public improvements and maintenance projects of the county or a political 2 subdivision located in whole or in part in the county, or while the defendant is serving the defendant's jail sentence, and in such 4 5 instances the defendant is entitled to the credit earned under this subsection during the time that the defendant has served and the 6 defendant shall only be required to pay the balance of the pecuniary 7 fine assessed against the defendant. A defendant who performs labor under this article during a day in which the defendant is confined 9 is entitled to both the credit for confinement and the credit for 10 labor provided by this article. 11
- 12 (k) A defendant is considered to have discharged \$150 [\$100]
  13 of fines or costs for each eight hours of community service
  14 performed under Subsection (f) of this article.
- 15 SECTION 2. Article 45A.251(e), Code of Criminal Procedure, 16 is amended to read as follows:
- 17 (e) In addition to credit under Subsection (d), in imposing a fine and costs in a case involving a misdemeanor punishable by 18 19 fine only, the justice or judge shall credit the defendant for any 20 period the defendant was confined in jail or prison while awaiting trial or serving a sentence for another offense if that confinement 21 occurred after the commission of the misdemeanor. The credit under 22 23 this subsection shall be applied to the amount of the fine and costs 24 at the rate of not less than \$150 for each day of confinement.
- SECTION 3. Article 45A.254(e), Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:
- (e) A defendant is considered to have discharged not less

- 1 than \$150 [\$100] of fines or costs for each eight hours of community
- 2 service performed under this article.
- 3 SECTION 4. Article 45A.459(i), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 4 is amended to read as follows:
- 5 (i) A defendant is considered to have discharged not less
- 6 than \$150 [\$100] of fines or costs for each eight hours of community
- 7 service performed under this article.
- 8 SECTION 5. Article 45A.460(i), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 9 is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (i) A defendant is considered to have discharged not less
- 11 than \$150 [\$100] of fines or costs for each eight hours of community
- 12 service performed under this article.
- SECTION 6. Article 43.09(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 14 amended by this Act, applies to a defendant who is confined or
- 15 performs labor to discharge fines or costs on or after the effective
- 16 date of this Act, regardless of whether the offense for which the
- 17 fines or costs were imposed occurred before, on, or after the
- 18 effective date of this Act.
- 19 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act to Articles
- 20 43.09(k), 45A.254(e), 45A.459(i), and 45A.460(i), Code of Criminal
- 21 Procedure, apply to a defendant who performs community service to
- 22 discharge fines or costs on or after the effective date of this Act,
- 23 regardless of whether the offense for which the fines or costs were
- 24 imposed occurred before, on, or after the effective date of this
- 25 Act.
- SECTION 8. Article 45A.251(e), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 27 as amended by this Act, applies to a defendant who is sentenced for

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- 1 an offense on or after the effective date of this Act, regardless of
- 2 whether the offense was committed before, on, or after that date.
- 3 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
