## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

| AN ACT |
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- 2 relating to the establishment of grant programs to provide
- 3 financial assistance to qualified sheriff's departments in certain
- rural counties. 4
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 130, Local Government
- Code, is amended by adding Section 130.9115 to read as follows: 7
- Sec. 130.9115. RURAL SHERIFF'S DEPUTY SHORTAGE RELIEF GRANT 8
- PROGRAM. (a) In this section: 9
- (1) "Deputy-to-resident ratio" means the ratio of the 10
- number of deputy sheriffs to the number of residents of the 11
- 12 unincorporated areas of the county, as determined by the population
- estimates provided by the state demographer under Section 468.004, 13
- 14 Government Code.
- (2) "Grant" means a grant authorized to be awarded by 15
- 16 the comptroller under the rural sheriff's deputy shortage relief
- grant program established by this section. 17
- 18 (3) "Investigative tool" means equipment, including
- software, used by a sheriff's office that is necessary for the 19
- investigation of cases. The term does not include services unless 20
- 21 the services are purchased in connection with the purchase of
- tangible equipment. 22
- 23 (4) "Investigator-to-patrol ratio" means the ratio of
- 24 the number of deputy sheriffs who primarily conduct case

- 1 investigations in the routine performance of the deputy's duties to
- 2 the number of deputy sheriffs who primarily make motor vehicle
- 3 stops in the routine performance of the deputy's duties.
- 4 (5) "Qualified county" means a county:
- 5 (A) with a population of 300,000 or less; and
- 6 (B) for which on January 1, 2025:
- 7 <u>(i) the deputy-to-resident ratio is less</u>
- 8 than 15 to 10,000; or
- 9 (ii) the investigator-to-patrol ratio is
- 10 less than one to five.
- 11 (6) "Qualified deputy position" means a deputy sheriff
- 12 position in a qualified county that:
- 13 (A) is held or will be held by a deputy sheriff
- 14 who primarily makes motor vehicle stops in the routine performance
- 15 of the deputy's duties;
- 16 (B) is in addition to a deputy sheriff position
- 17 held in the county on January 1, 2025;
- 18 (C) is not considered a qualified investigator
- 19 position; and
- (D) when aggregated with each other qualified
- 21 deputy position would result in a deputy-to-resident ratio of 15 to
- 22 10,000, determined as of January 1, 2025.
- 23 (7) "Qualified emergency dispatcher" means a person
- 24 who primarily provides communication support services for a
- 25 sheriff's office by responding to requests for assistance in
- 26 emergencies.
- 27 (8) "Qualified investigative support staff member"

- 1 means a person who primarily provides technical support services
- 2 for a qualified investigator in the investigation of an offense,
- 3 including a person who provides evidence testing or analysis
- 4 services.
- 5 (9) "Qualified investigator position" means a deputy
- 6 sheriff position in a qualified county that:
- 7 (A) is held or will be held by a deputy sheriff
- 8 who primarily conducts case investigations in the routine
- 9 performance of the deputy's duties;
- 10 (B) is in addition to a deputy sheriff position
- 11 held in the county on January 1, 2025; and
- 12 (C) when aggregated with each other qualified
- 13 investigator position would result in an investigator-to-patrol
- 14 ratio of one to five, determined as of January 1, 2025.
- 15 (b) The comptroller shall establish and administer the
- 16 rural sheriff's deputy shortage relief grant program to support the
- 17 state purpose of ensuring professional law enforcement throughout
- 18 the state by providing financial assistance to sheriff's
- 19 departments in qualified counties.
- 20 (c) Not later than the 30th day after the first day of a
- 21 qualified county's fiscal year, the county may submit an
- 22 application for a grant to the comptroller. The county must
- 23 indicate in the application the number of qualified deputy
- 24 positions, qualified investigator positions, qualified emergency
- 25 dispatcher positions, and qualified investigative support staff
- 26 member positions the county is requesting for inclusion in the
- 27 determination of the amount of the grant for that fiscal year and

- 1 the number of qualified deputy positions and qualified investigator
- 2 positions for which the county is requesting additional funds
- 3 described by Subsections (d)(2) and (4). A county may submit only
- 4 one application each fiscal year.
- 5 (d) Subject to Subsections (e), (f), (g), (h), and (k), the
- 6 comptroller shall award a grant to a qualified county that applies
- 7 for the grant using money appropriated to the comptroller for that
- 8 purpose. The grant must be in the following amount:
- 9 (1) \$50,000 for each qualified deputy position
- 10 indicated by the county in the application for that fiscal year;
- 11 (2) an additional \$50,000 for each qualified deputy
- 12 position indicated in the application for that fiscal year, unless
- 13 the county has received a grant under this subdivision for that
- 14 position in a preceding fiscal year;
- 15 (3) \$50,000 for each qualified investigator position
- 16 indicated by the county in the application for that fiscal year
- 17 necessary for an investigator-to-patrol ratio of one to five after
- 18 filling the qualified deputy positions under the grant;
- 19 (4) an additional \$50,000 for each qualified
- 20 investigator position indicated in the application for that fiscal
- 21 year, unless the county has received a grant under this subdivision
- 22 for that position in a preceding fiscal year;
- (5) \$35,000 for each qualified emergency dispatcher
- 24 indicated by the county in the application for that fiscal year; and
- 25 (6) \$35,000 for each qualified investigative support
- 26 staff member indicated by the county in the application for that
- 27 fiscal year.

- 1 (e) This subsection applies only to a fiscal year of a qualified county that meets the deputy-to-resident ratio described 2 3 by Subsection (a)(5)(B)(i) during a calendar year that begins on or after January 1, 2025, but before the calendar year in which the 4 5 fiscal year begins. A qualified county is not eligible to receive a grant under this section for a fiscal year unless the county adopts 6 7 a budget for the fiscal year that provides for the employment of a 8 number of deputy sheriffs necessary to meet the deputy-to-resident ratio of at least 15 to 10,000, determined as of January 1 of the 9 10 calendar year in which the fiscal year begins.
- (f) This subsection applies only to a fiscal year of a 11 12 qualified county for which the number of qualified deputy positions the county is otherwise entitled to receive a grant for under this 13 14 section is greater than the number of qualified deputy positions 15 the county would be entitled to receive a grant for under this section if the deputy-to-resident ratio described by Subsection 16 17 (a)(5)(B)(i) is determined as of January 1 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year begins instead of January 1, 2025. 18 19 qualified county is entitled to receive a grant under this section only for the number of qualified deputy positions the county would 20 be entitled to receive a grant for if the deputy-to-resident ratio 21 described by Subsection (a)(5)(B)(i) is determined as of January 1 22 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year begins instead of 23 24 January 1, 2025.
- 25 (g) This subsection applies only to a fiscal year of a 26 qualified county that meets the investigator-to-patrol ratio 27 described by Subsection (a)(5)(B)(ii) during a calendar year that

- 1 begins on or after January 1, 2025, but before the calendar year in
- 2 which the fiscal year begins. A qualified county is not eligible to
- 3 receive a grant under this section for a fiscal year unless the
- 4 county adopts a budget for the fiscal year that provides for the
- 5 employment of a number of deputy sheriffs necessary to meet the
- 6 investigator-to-patrol ratio of at least one to five, determined as
- 7 of January 1 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year begins.
- 8 (h) This subsection applies only to a fiscal year of a
- 9 qualified county for which the number of qualified investigator
- 10 positions the county is otherwise entitled to receive a grant for
- 11 under this section is greater than the number of qualified
- 12 investigator positions the county would be entitled to receive a
- 13 grant for under this section if the investigator-to-patrol ratio
- 14 described by Subsection (a)(5)(B)(ii) is determined as of January 1
- 15 of the calendar year in which the fiscal year begins instead of
- 16 January 1, 2025. A qualified county is entitled to receive a grant
- 17 under this section only for the number of qualified investigator
- 18 positions the county would be entitled to receive a grant for if the
- 19 investigator-to-patrol ratio described by Subsection (a)(5)(B)(ii)
- 20 is determined as of January 1 of the calendar year in which the
- 21 fiscal year begins instead of January 1, 2025.
- (i) A county that is awarded a grant shall use or authorize
- 23 the use of the grant money only:
- 24 (1) to provide to each deputy sheriff who fills a
- 25 qualified deputy position a minimum annual salary of at least
- 26 \$45,000;
- 27 (2) to provide to each deputy sheriff who fills a

- 1 qualified investigator position a minimum annual salary of at least
- 2 \$45,000;
- 3 (3) to provide to each dispatcher who fills a
- 4 qualified emergency dispatcher position a minimum annual salary of
- 5 at least \$30,000;
- 6 (4) to provide to each investigative support staff
- 7 member who fills a qualified investigative support staff position a
- 8 minimum salary of at least \$30,000;
- 9 (5) to purchase vehicles, firearms, and safety
- 10 equipment for the use of a deputy sheriff who fills a qualified
- 11 deputy position; and
- 12 (6) to purchase vehicles, firearms, investigative
- 13 tools, and safety equipment for the use of a deputy sheriff who
- 14 fills a qualified investigator position.
- (j) A county that is awarded a grant may not reduce the
- 16 sheriff's department budget for the county's fiscal year following
- 17 the fiscal year in which the comptroller awards the grant.
- 18 (k) The total dollar amount awarded under this section may
- 19 not exceed \$150 million in a state fiscal year. If the total dollar
- 20 amount of grants to which counties are entitled under this section
- 21 <u>exceeds the limitation under this subsection in a state fiscal</u>
- 22 year, the comptroller shall proportionally reduce the amount of
- 23 each grant awarded so the limitation is not exceeded.
- 24 (1) The comptroller shall adopt rules necessary to
- 25 implement this section, including rules that establish:
- 26 (1) a standardized application process, including the
- 27 form to be used to apply for a grant and the manner of submitting the

| 13 | SECTION 2. A qualified county, as defined by Section                 |
| 14 | 130.9115, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, may not apply |
| 15 | for a grant under that section before September 1, 2026.             |
| 16 | SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.                  |
