A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the use of funds awarded under the Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) $\mbox{Grant Program.}$ 1-22 1-23 1-24

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Section 134.004(b), Education Code, is amended 1-26 to read as follows:

1-27 1-28 (b) Grants may be awarded under this chapter from the Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) fund:

(1) to defray the start-up costs associated with the 1-29 development of new career and technical education programs at 1-30 1-31 public junior colleges, public technical institutes, public state colleges, and school districts and open-enrollment charter schools described under Section 134.007 that meet the requirements of 1-32 1-33 1-34 Section 134.006; and

1-35 (2) to pay costs for the acquisition, implementation, and ongoing maintenance of technology solutions necessary to support programs described by Subdivision (1). SECTION 2. Section 134.006(b), Education Code, is amended 1-36 1-37

1-38 1-39 to read as follows: 1-40

(b) A grant received under this section may be used only:

(1) to support courses or programs that prepare students for career employment in occupations that are identified by local businesses as being in high demand, including courses 1-41 1-42 1-43 1-44 offered for dual credit;

1-45 (2) to finance initial costs of career and technical 1-46 education course or program development, including the costs of constructing or renovating facilities, purchasing equipment, and other expenses associated with the development of a new course; 1-47 1-48 1-49 [and]

1-50 (3) to finance a career and technical education course or program that leads to a license, certificate, or postsecondary 1-51 1-52 degree; and

1-53 to finance the acquisition, implementation, (4)and 1-54 ongoing maintenance of technology solutions necessary to support a <u>course or program described by Subdivision (1), (2), or (3).</u> SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a grant awarded on or after the effective date of this Act. 1-55 1-56
