1	AN ACT
2	relating to the use of glucagon medication on certain public and
3	private school campuses.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 168.001, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Subdivision (1-a) and amending Subdivisions (4)
7	and (5) to read as follows:
8	(1-a) "Glucagon medication" means any medication used
9	to treat hypoglycemia that contains glucagon.

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- 10 (4) "School," unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, means a school district [public elementary or secondary 11 12 school. The term does not include an open-enrollment charter school established under Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code]. 13
- (5) "School employee," unless the context clearly 14 indicates otherwise, means a person employed by: 15
- (A) a school; 16
- 17 a local health department that assists a (B) school under this chapter; or 18
- 19 another entity with which a school has 20 contracted to perform its duties under this chapter.
- 21 SECTION 2. Chapter 168, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 22 by adding Sections 168.012 and 168.013 to read as follows:
- Sec. 168.012. MAINTENANCE AND ADMINISTRATION OF GLUCAGON 23 MEDICATION. (a) A school district, open-enrollment charter 24

- 1 school, or private school may adopt and implement a policy
- 2 regarding the maintenance, administration, and disposal of
- 3 glucagon medication at each campus in the district or school.
- 4 (b) A policy adopted under Subsection (a):
- 5 (1) must provide that a school nurse or an unlicensed
- 6 diabetes care assistant may:
- 7 (A) administer glucagon medication to a student
- 8 who is reasonably believed to be experiencing hypoglycemia and for
- 9 whom:
- (i) a diabetes management and treatment
- 11 plan has been submitted to the district or school; and
- 12 (ii) an individualized health plan, as
- 13 described by Section 168.003, has been developed for the student;
- 14 and
- 15 (B) carry glucagon medication prescribed in the
- 16 <u>name of the district or school on the nurse's or assistant's person</u>
- 17 to administer to a student described by Paragraph (A); and
- 18 (2) may not require a district or school to purchase
- 19 glucagon medication or require the district or school to make any
- 20 other expenditure related to the maintenance or administration of
- 21 glucagon medication that would result in a negative fiscal impact
- 22 <u>on the district or school.</u>
- 23 <u>(c) The supply of glucagon medication at a campus subject to</u>
- 24 a policy adopted under Subsection (a) must be stored in a secure
- 25 location and be easily accessible to a school nurse and unlicensed
- 26 diabetes care assistant.
- 27 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if

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   an open-enrollment charter school or private school adopts a policy
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   under Subsection (a):
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               (1) the parent or guardian of a student with diabetes
   who is enrolled in the school may submit a diabetes management and
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   treatment plan developed in accordance with Section 168.002 to the
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   school;
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               (2) the school may seek school employees who are not
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   health care professionals to serve as unlicensed diabetes care
   assistants for purposes of administering glucagon medication under
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   the policy; and
               (3) the following provisions of this chapter apply to
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   the school as if the school were a school district and to a school
   employee of the school, including a school nurse or unlicensed
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   diabetes care assistant, as if the school employee were employed by
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   a school district:
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                    (A) Section 168.002(c);
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                    (B) Section 168.003 with respect to each student
   who submits a diabetes management and treatment plan to the school;
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                    (C) Sections 168.004(b) and (c);
                    (D) Section 168.005; and
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                    (E) Section 168.009.
              The executive commissioner, in consultation with the
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          (e)
   commissioner of the Texas Education Agency, shall adopt rules

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Sec. 168.013. PRESCRIPTION OF GLUCAGON MEDICATION. (a) A

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- 1 physician or person who has been delegated prescriptive authority
- 2 under Chapter 157, Occupations Code, may prescribe glucagon
- 3 medication in the name of a school district, open-enrollment
- 4 charter school, or private school that adopts a policy under
- 5 Section 168.012(a).
- 6 (b) A physician or other person who prescribes glucagon
- 7 medication under Subsection (a) shall provide the school district,
- 8 open-enrollment charter school, or private school with a standing
- 9 order for the administration of glucagon medication to a student
- 10 described by Section 168.012(b)(1)(A).
- 11 <u>(c)</u> The standing order under Subsection (b) is not required
- 12 to be patient-specific, and the glucagon medication may be
- 13 <u>administered to a person without a previously established</u>
- 14 physician-patient relationship.
- 15 (d) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law,
- 16 supervision or delegation by a physician is considered adequate if
- 17 the physician:
- 18 (1) periodically reviews the order; and
- 19 (2) is available through direct telecommunication as
- 20 needed for consultation, assistance, and direction.
- 21 (e) A pharmacist may dispense glucagon medication to a
- 22 school district, open-enrollment charter school, or private school
- 23 that adopts a policy under Section 168.012(a) without requiring the
- 24 name or any other identifying information relating to the user.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 26 school year.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
