(d) A person commits an offense if the person violates this 11 12 section. An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor.

(e) This section does not impose liability on any of the 13 following persons for political advertising published, 14 15 distributed, or broadcast by or at the direction of another person: 16 (1) an interactive computer service, as defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 230(f); 17 (2) an Internet service provider, cloud service 18 provider, cybersecurity service provider, communication service 19 provider, or telecommunications network; 20 21 (3) a radio or television broadcaster, including a 22 cable or satellite television network operator, programmer, or 23 producer; or

24 (4) the owner or operator of a commercial sign, as
25 defined by Section 391.001, Transportation Code.
