## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN ACT

- 2 relating to immunization requirements.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 38.001(b), Education Code, as amended by
- 5 Chapter 43 (H.B. 1098), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular
- 6 Session, 2007, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The [Subject to Subsections (b-1) and (c), the]
- 8 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 9 may <u>not</u> modify or delete any of the immunizations in Subsection (a)
- 10 or [may] require immunizations against additional diseases as a
- 11 requirement for admission to any elementary or secondary school.
- SECTION 2. Section 38.001(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (b-1) Each year, the Department of State Health Services
- 15 shall prepare a list of the immunizations required under <u>Subsection</u>
- 16 (a) [this section] for admission to public schools [and of any
- 17 additional immunizations the department recommends for school-age
- 18 children]. The department shall prepare the list in English and
- 19 Spanish and make the list available in a manner that permits a
- 20 school district to easily post the list on the district's Internet
- 21 website as required by Section 38.019.
- SECTION 3. Section 38.019(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (a) A school district that maintains an Internet website

- 1 shall post prominently on the website:
- 2 (1) a list, in English and Spanish, of:
- 3 (A) the immunizations required for admission to
- 4 public school in accordance with [by rules of the Department of
- 5 State Health Services adopted under] Section 38.001; and
- 6 (B) [any immunizations or vaccines recommended
- 7 for public school students by the Department of State Health
- 8 Services; and
- 9  $\left[\frac{\text{(C)}}{\text{)}}\right]$  health clinics in the district that offer
- 10 the influenza vaccine, to the extent those clinics are known to the
- 11 district; and
- 12 (2) a link to the page on the Department of State
- 13 Health Services Internet website that provides [where a person may
- 14 obtain] information relating to the procedures for claiming an
- 15 exemption from the immunization requirements of Section 38.001.
- 16 SECTION 4. Section 81.023, Health and Safety Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 81.023. IMMUNIZATION. (a) The executive commissioner
- 19 may recommend to the legislature immunizations to include on the
- 20 <u>list of immunizations required</u> [department shall develop
- 21 immunization requirements] for children under Section 38.001(a),
- 22 <u>Education Code</u>.
- 23 (b) The department shall cooperate with the Department of
- 24 Family and Protective Services in [formulating and] implementing
- 25 the immunization requirements for children admitted to child-care
- 26 facilities.
- 27 (c) The department shall cooperate with the State Board of

- 1 Education in [formulating and] implementing immunization
- 2 requirements for students admitted to public or private primary or
- 3 secondary schools.
- 4 SECTION 5. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 5 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.0035 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 161.0035. PROHIBITED IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS. (a)
- 7 Except as provided by Subsection (b), a governmental entity may not
- 8 compel or require an individual to receive an immunization,
- 9 including an immunization listed on the immunization schedules
- 10 developed by the federal Centers for Disease Control and
- 11 Prevention.
- 12 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to an immunization
- 13 required by this subchapter or Section 38.001 or 51.933, Education
- 14 Code.
- SECTION 6. Section 161.004(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) Every child in the state shall be immunized against
- 18 vaccine preventable diseases caused by infectious agents in
- 19 accordance with Section 38.001, Education Code [the immunization
- 20 schedule adopted in department rules].
- 21 SECTION 7. Section 42.043(b), Human Resources Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (b) The department shall require that each child at an
- 24 appropriate age have a test for tuberculosis and be immunized
- 25 against the diseases listed in Section 38.001, Education Code
- 26 [diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, mumps, rubella, rubeola,
- 27 invasive pneumococcal disease, and hepatitis A and against any

- 1 other communicable disease as recommended by the Department of
- 2 State Health Services]. The immunization must be effective on the
- 3 date of first entry into the facility. However, a child may be
- 4 provisionally admitted if the required immunizations have begun and
- 5 are completed as rapidly as medically feasible.
- 6 SECTION 8. The following provisions of the Education Code
- 7 are repealed:
- 8 (1) Section 38.001(b), as amended by Chapter 94 (H.B.
- 9 1059), Acts of the 80th Legislature, Regular Session, 2007; and
- 10 (2) Section 38.001(f).
- SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 12 school year.
- 13 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 14 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 15 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 16 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 17 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
