H.B. No. 469

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the enforcement of commercial motor vehicle safety
3 standards in certain counties.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 644.101(c), Transportation Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (c) A sheriff or a deputy sheriff of any of the following
8 counties is eligible to apply for certification under this section:

- 9 (1) a county bordering the United Mexican States;
10 (2) a county with a population of less than 1,000, part
11 of which is located within 75 miles of an international border;
12 (3) a county with a population of 700,000 or more;
13 (4) a county with a population of 400,000 or more that
14 borders the county in which the State Capitol is located;
15 (5) a county with a population of less than 250,000
16 that:

17 (A) is adjacent to two counties that each have a
18 population of more than 1.2 million; and

19 (B) contains two highways that are part of the
20 national system of interstate and defense highways;

21 (6) a county:

22 (A) any part of which is within 30 miles of New
23 Mexico; and

24 (B) that is adjacent to two or more counties that

1 generated \$100 million or more in tax revenue collected under
2 Chapters 201 and 202, Tax Code, from oil and gas production during
3 the preceding state fiscal year;

4 (7) a county with a population of more than 40,000 and
5 less than 300,000 that is adjacent to a county described by
6 Subdivision (4); ~~or~~

7 (8) a county with a population of more than 50,000 and
8 less than 90,000 that is adjacent to a county with a population of
9 more than 4,000,000; or

10 (9) a county that contains an international port.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
