## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an exemption from jury service for certain crime
- 3 victims or close relatives of deceased crime victims.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 62.106(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person qualified to serve as a petit juror may
- 8 establish an exemption from jury service if the person:
- 9 (1) is over 75 years of age;
- 10 (2) has legal custody of a child younger than 12 years
- 11 of age and the person's service on the jury requires leaving the
- 12 child without adequate supervision;
- 13 (3) is a student of a public or private secondary
- 14 school;
- 15 (4) is a person enrolled and in actual attendance at an
- 16 institution of higher education;
- 17 (5) is an officer or an employee of the senate, the
- 18 house of representatives, or any department, commission, board,
- 19 office, or other agency in the legislative branch of state
- 20 government;
- 21 (6) is summoned for service in a county with a
- 22 population of at least 200,000, unless that county uses a jury plan
- 23 under Section 62.011 and the period authorized under Section
- 24 62.011(b)(5) exceeds two years, and the person has served as a petit

- 1 juror in the county during the 24-month period preceding the date
- 2 the person is to appear for jury service;
- 3 (7) is the primary caretaker of a person who is unable
- 4 to care for himself or herself;
- 5 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b), is summoned
- 6 for service in a county with a population of at least 250,000 and
- 7 the person has served as a petit juror in the county during the
- 8 three-year period preceding the date the person is to appear for
- 9 jury service; [<del>or</del>]
- 10 (9) is a member of the United States military forces
- 11 serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from the
- 12 person's home station and out of the person's county of residence;
- 13 or
- 14 (10) is a victim or close relative of a deceased victim
- of a crime, as those terms are defined by Article 56A.001, Code of
- 16 <u>Criminal Procedure, who:</u>
- 17 (A) testified in a court proceeding relating to
- 18 the offense of which the person or the person's deceased close
- 19 relative was a victim; and
- 20 (B) would suffer severe anxiety or
- 21 post-traumatic stress as a result of attending a court proceeding.
- 22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 23 to an exemption from jury service for a person who is summoned to
- 24 appear for service on or after the effective date of this Act. Ar
- 25 exemption from jury service for a person who is summoned to appear
- 26 for service before the effective date of this Act is covered by the
- 27 law in effect when the person was summoned, and that law is

- 1 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
