10 (9) is a member of the United States military forces 11 serving on active duty and deployed to a location away from the 12 person's home station and out of the person's county of residence<u>;</u> 13 or

14 (10) is a victim or close relative of a deceased victim
15 of a crime, as those terms are defined by Article 56A.001, Code of
16 Criminal Procedure, who:

17 <u>(A) testified in a court proceeding relating to</u> 18 the offense of which the person or the person's deceased close 19 <u>relative was a victim; and</u>

20(B) would suffer severe anxiety or21post-traumatic stress as a result of attending a court proceeding.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an exemption from jury service for a person who is summoned to appear for service on or after the effective date of this Act. An exemption from jury service for a person who is summoned to appear for service before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the person was summoned, and that law is
