4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (h-3) to read as follows:
7	(h-3) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
8	government component of the social studies curriculum for high
9	school students, the State Board of Education shall adopt essential
10	knowledge and skills to develop each student's civic knowledge,

12	(1) the role of governmental officials, including:
13	(A) statewide elected officials;
14	(B) county officials;
15	(C) city councilors; and
16	(D) other local governmental officials;
17	(2) the voting process and election laws of this

19	(3) the eligibility requirements to run for elected

21	(4) Robert's Rules of Order; and
22	(5) the elected officials who represent the student at

- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
