## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the reporting by law enforcement agencies of missing
- 3 children to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 63.00905(a), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 6 as added by Chapter 729 (H.B. 2660), Acts of the 88th Legislature,
- 7 Regular Session, 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Regardless of the jurisdiction in which the child went
- 9 missing, a law enforcement agency, on receiving a report of a
- 10 missing child, shall:
- 11 (1) immediately start an investigation in order to
- 12 determine the present location of the child;
- 13 (2) immediately, but not later than two hours after
- 14 receiving the report, enter the name of the child into the
- 15 clearinghouse and the national crime information center missing
- 16 person file if the child meets the center's criteria, with all
- 17 available identifying features such as dental records,
- 18 fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of
- 19 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information
- 20 describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained
- 21 the missing child;
- 22 (3) immediately, but not later than two hours after
- 23 the agency receives the report, enter the applicable information
- 24 into:

- 1 (A) the Texas Law Enforcement Telecommunications
- 2 System or a successor system of telecommunication used by law
- 3 enforcement agencies and operated by the Department of Public
- 4 Safety; and
- 5 (B) the National Center for Missing and Exploited
- 6 Children;
- 7 (4) not later than 48 hours after receiving the
- 8 report, electronically submit to each municipal or county law
- 9 enforcement agency within 200 miles the report and any information
- 10 that may help determine the present location of the child;
- 11 (5) not later than the 30th day after the date the
- 12 agency receives the report, enter the name of the child into the
- 13 National Missing and Unidentified Persons System, with all
- 14 available identifying features such as dental records,
- 15 fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of
- 16 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information
- 17 describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained
- 18 the missing child; and
- 19 (6) inform the person who filed the report of the
- 20 missing child that the information will be:
- 21 (A) entered into the clearinghouse, the national
- 22 crime information center missing person file, the National Center
- 23 for Missing and Exploited Children, and the National Missing and
- 24 Unidentified Persons System; and
- 25 (B) submitted to each municipal or county law
- 26 enforcement agency within 200 miles.
- 27 SECTION 2. Article 63.00905(a), Code of Criminal Procedure,
