A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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2 relating to the assignment of certain retired and former justices 3 and judges.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 74.003(b), Government Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 (b) The chief justice of the supreme court may assign a 8 qualified former or retired justice or judge of the supreme court, 9 of the court of criminal appeals, or of a court of appeals to a court 10 of appeals for active service regardless of whether a vacancy 11 exists in the court to which the justice or judge is assigned. To be 12 eligible for assignment under this subsection, a former or retired 13 justice or judge must:

14 (1) have served as an active justice or judge for at 15 least <u>72</u> [96] months in a district, statutory probate, statutory 16 county, or appellate court, with at least 48 of those months in an 17 appellate court;

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(2) not have been removed from office;

19 (3) certify under oath to the chief justice of the20 supreme court, on a form prescribed by the chief justice, that:

(A) the justice or judge has never been publicly
reprimanded or censured by the State Commission on Judicial
Conduct; and

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(B) the justice or judge:

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1 (i) did not resign or retire from office after the State Commission on Judicial Conduct notified the justice 2 3 or judge of the commencement of a full investigation into an allegation or appearance of misconduct or disability of the justice 4 5 or judge as provided in Section 33.022 and before the final disposition of that investigation; or 6 7 (ii) if the justice or judge did resign from 8 office under circumstances described by Subparagraph (i), the justice or judge was not publicly reprimanded or censured as a 9 10 result of the investigation; annually demonstrate that the justice or judge has 11 (4) 12 completed in the past state fiscal year the educational 13 requirements for active appellate court justices or judges; [and] 14 (5) certify to the chief justice of the supreme court a 15 willingness not to appear and plead as an attorney in any court of appeals in this state or district, statutory probate, or statutory 16 17 county court in a county under the jurisdiction of the appellate court to which the justice or judge is assigned for a period of two 18 19 years; and (6) certify to the chief justice a willingness not to 20 hear any matter involving a party who is a current or former client 21 of the justice or judge for the duration of the assignment. 22 SECTION 2. Section 74.041(6), Government Code, is amended 23 24 to read as follows: (6) "Retired judge" means: 25 26 (A) a retiree; or 27 a person who served as an active judge for at (B)

H.B. No. 1181 1 least 72 [96] months in a statutory probate or statutory county court and has retired under the Texas County and District 2 3 Retirement System. SECTION 3. Section 74.055(c), Government Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: 6 (c) To be eligible to be named on the list, a retired or 7 former judge must: 8 (1) have served as an active judge for at least 72 [96] months in a district, statutory probate, statutory county, or 9 10 appellate court; have developed substantial experience in the 11 (2) 12 judge's area of specialty; not have been removed from office; 13 (3) 14 (4) certify under oath to the presiding judge, on a 15 form prescribed by the state board of regional judges, that: 16 (A) the judge has never been publicly reprimanded 17 or censured by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct; and (B) the judge: 18 did not resign or retire from office 19 (i) after the State Commission on Judicial Conduct notified the judge 20 21 of the commencement of a full investigation into an allegation or appearance of misconduct or disability of the judge as provided in 22 Section 33.022 and before the final disposition of 23 that 24 investigation; or 25 (ii) if the judge did resign from office 26 under circumstances described by Subparagraph (i), was not publicly reprimanded or censured as a result of the investigation; 27

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1 (5) annually demonstrate that the judge has completed 2 in the past state fiscal year the educational requirements for 3 active district, statutory probate, and statutory county court 4 judges; [and]

5 (6) certify to the presiding judge a willingness not 6 to appear and plead as an attorney in any court in <u>the</u> 7 <u>administrative judicial region in which the judge is assigned</u> [this 8 <u>state</u>] for a period of two years; and

9 (7) certify to the presiding judge a willingness not 10 to hear any matter involving a party who is a current or former 11 client of the judge for the duration of the assignment.

SECTION 4. Sections 74.003(b), 74.041(6), and 74.055(c), Government Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to the assignment of a justice or judge on or after the effective date of this Act. The assignment of a justice or judge before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date of the assignment, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
