8	proposes on renewal of a tenant's lease to increase the amount of
9	rent the landlord charges the tenant shall provide written notice
10	to the tenant in accordance with this section.
11	(b) The notice required by Subsection (a) must state:
12	(1) the amount of the tenant's rent after the increase;
13	(2) the improvements to the tenant's rental unit or
14	another part of the premises that have resulted in the rent
15	increase, if any; and
16	(3) the effective date of the rent increase.
17	(c) The landlord shall provide the notice required by
18	Subsection (a) not later than the seventh day before the date the
19	tenant is required to provide notice to vacate at the end of the
20	<u>lease term.</u>
21	(d) If a landlord fails to provide notice as required by
